Strength in Dollar Fails to Bring Out Selling:

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—Stocks

A minor trend in the dollar had a depressing effect on market sentiment, but it failed to bring out selling, and the market lapsed into extreme dullness after first sales.

United States Steel common stock, one of Monday's leaders, opened at 54½, unchanged. General Motors was firm at 31½, up ½. Allied Chemical gained a point to 133, while American Telephone lost ¾.
