The screen actress claims she did not know Read was married when she first accepted his kisses and then she understood that he would be divorced when he continued showering her with them.

ONE of the letters Read wrote after he left her in New York in 1931 provoked mixed emotions as Attorney Walter J. Little, representing Mrs. Reed, read: "I have your picture with me

... I only wish I had those beautiful eyes and long lashes now. Hope your ankle is better. "What you need is another rubdown from some one that is very much in love with you."

Little cleared his throat. He glanced severely at the actress, sitting calmly in the witness stand. Read squirmed, mopping his brow.

"Good Lord!... he groaned, "I wish I was in China." Mrs. Reed sobbed.

"Does that mean," the attorney inquired, "that Mr. Read was in the habit of giving you rubdowns?"

"Well," said the actress, "he rubbed my ankle five or six times after I had sprained it."
