

Johnny Kling Is New K. C. Owner

KANSAS CITY, Sept. 4.—Johnny Kling, who was a star catcher for the Chicago Cubs from 1901 to 1912, is the new owner of the Kansas City Blues, last-place club in the American Association.

He purchased controlling interest in the franchise from E. Lee Keyser of Des Moines, owner of the club this season. Keyser, who also owns the Des Moines Western League club, remains as a director, vice president and general manager. This Speaker, another former big league star, also will be a director, and veteran Nick Allen will remain as manager. Kling announced a drastic shakeup in the club roster. Only six players now with the club will be retained, he said.
