Following the welcoming address the state officers will give reports: President, Mrs. W. J. Hockett; re-

cording secretary, Mrs. Clayton H. Ridge; treasurer, Mrs. Thomas Ross; auditor, Mrs. S. M. Myers, and historian, Mrs. R. A. Achter.

Other features of Tuesday's program include an address on "Today's Child, Tomorrow's Citizen" by Mrs. Arthur C. Watkins, educational secretary of the national congress; presentation of standards and awarding of certificates by M. W. Blair; committee reports; demonstration of study circle by School 76 in Indianapolis; and a parliamentary drill.

The Silver Star dinner is at 6, with Mrs. Logan G. Hughes presiding, and chairman of standing committees, A to M, as special guests. The discussion will be concerned with city council panel, county council panel, high school activities and rural life.
