

## WOMAN GRILLED IN SHOOTING OF FATHER OF NINE

Suicide Attempt After  
Quarrel With Wife  
Is Blamed.

Carl Stewart, 35, Beech Grove, today was in critical condition at city hospital, following an abdominal operation for removal of a revolver bullet.

Police were probing into circumstances of the shooting, in connection with which Mrs. Opal Simon, 23, of 914 Buchanan street, is held under high bond on vagrancy charges. She said the injury resulted from a suicide attempt.

Mrs. Simon, who has a bullet wound on the tip of a finger, told police that after a drinking party late Sunday at the home of Mrs. Simon's parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Richardson, 440 West Norwood street, Stewart drew a revolver, said he was going to kill himself and went to the kitchen.

Following him, she said, she struggled with him for possession of the weapon, which was discharged twice, one bullet striking her finger and the other Stewart's abdomen.

Police found Stewart lying unconscious in the front part of the home.

Officers were informed that Stewart, father of nine children, had quarreled with Mrs. Stewart several days ago and that he had been staying at the Richardson home.
