# A BOOK A DAY

THE best writer of detective stories now practicing that noble art in America seems, beyond question, to be Mignon G. Eberhardt. She has the wit to see that a story of that kind stands or falls, not by the intricacy of its plot, but by the skill with which its atmosphere is created and its characters presented. Her books, without exception, are bell-ringers. Her latest, "The Dark Garden" (Crime Club, \$2) is not her best, but it is good enough. It has to do with a lonely mansion on the outskirts of Chicago, where a cantankerous female is mysteriously slain. The mystery is puzzling and the solution is ingenious; what makes the book really good is the way the writer gets an air of horror and eerie suspense into her pages. Another top-notch is "The Doctor's First Murder," by Robert Hare (Longmans-Green, \$2). An English doctor cooks up a foolproof method to commit a murder, goes out to commit it—and finds that some one else already has done it, using precisely the scheme he himself had invented. This, as you can imagine, leaves him in a spot. In sheer self-defense he has to find out who the guilty party is. Like the other book, this one skillfully builds up its atmosphere of suspense and shivers. "Drury Lane's Last Case," by Barnaby Rook (Viking, \$2) is pretty accurate. It centers about the theft of certain rare books from a New York museum, the bombing of a lonely house, a dizzy case of mistaken identity—and, of course, a murder. A far-fetched plot, some truly abominable writing, and a needless parade of erudition about Shakespeare combine to reduce its entertainment value to a remarkably low level. The one comfort is that it's Drury Lane's last case.

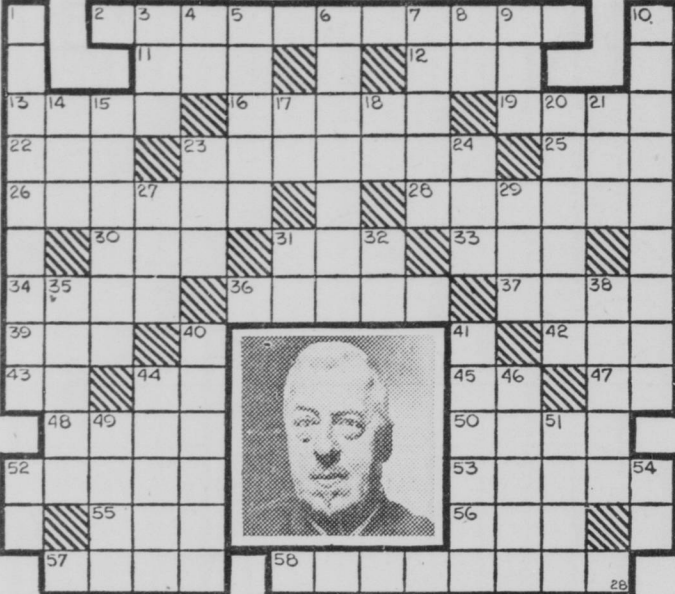

## FILLING STATION BAN IS APPLIED ON NORTH SIDE

### Board of Zoning Appeals Turns Down Two Proposals.

Rezoning of the northwest corner of Pennsylvania and Sixty-second streets for a filling station was denied by the board of zoning appeals yesterday.

The petition was filed by J. W. Robbins and C. B. Durham, through Attorney Lloyd D. Claycomb, who said the property, near the new White river bridge, never will be useful for anything except a business site.

When adjoining property owners objected, the board denied petition to erect a filling station at the northwest corner of Forty-sixth street and College avenue.

Providence Miceli was granted a variance for a combination drive-in market, to be operated by the Kroger company, and a Pure Oil Company filling station, at the southwest corner of Fifty-fourth street and College avenue.

The Guarantee Oil Company was permitted to erect five 20,000 gallon gasoline storage tanks at 120 South State avenue.

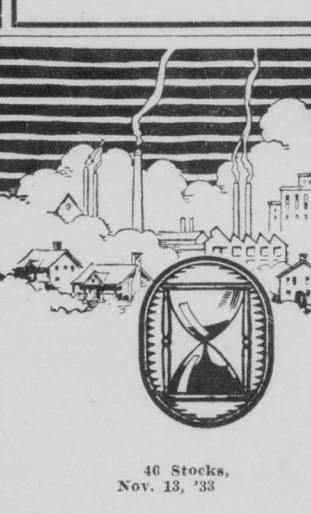
