

LEATHER FIRM PURCHASED BY PREST-O-LITE

Increase in Employment
Expected to Result
From Transaction.

Sale of the American Leather Products Corporation, makers of sales equipment, to the Prest-O-Lite Storage Battery Corporation, was announced today by R. R. Scott, sales manager.

Equipment and supplies of the leather firm are being moved from the old location, 1103 West Twenty-second street, to the Prest-O-Lite plant in Speedway City. Mr. Scott becomes vice-president in charge of sales. J. H. McDuffee, vice-president and general manager of Prest-O-Lite, becomes president.

The leather firm was thrown into receivership a year ago. A 50 per cent increase in employment is expected through the purchase. The American Leather Products Company was organized in 1911.

Last of Species in Captivity Follows
Mother.

NEW YORK, Dec. 29.—Despite the utmost care, an orphaned baby

vampire bat, last of a family captured in Panama, died in the darkest corner of its cage, in the reptile house of the Bronx zoo.

The little fellow succumbed a day after his mother was found dead from a cause still undetermined. They were the only ones of the

species ever exhibited in captivity. The father died at sea.

Dr. Raymond L. Ditmars, curator, had sought to keep the bat alive by feeding it concentrated blood and milk.

G. O. P. QUIET BUT NOT DEAD, SAYS WATSON

Former Senator Comments
on Article in Saturday
Evening Post.

Former Senator James E. Watson agrees with the editorial in the current issue of the Saturday Evening Post charging that current G. O. P. leadership is "dormant."

But he does not agree that the party has been laid aside by "stand-patism" and reactionaries as the editorial sets out. The magazine urged a new liberal leadership for the Republican party as opposed to what it terms the radicalism of the Democrats.

"It is ridiculous to think that the party that has had charge of the government for seventy years is going out of business," Mr. Watson asserted. "It is the minority party and can make itself felt."

"There is no such thing as a 'standpatter.' Furthermore, I don't believe there is an extreme right in the party. Today there are many extreme lefts."

The former senator arrived in Indianapolis yesterday for visits in the state. He intends to be in Winchester and Rushville during the next few days.
