

FRANCE LAUDS PEACE SPEECH OF ROOSEVELT

Official Statement Pledges
Nation's Support of
Every Point.

PARIS, Dec. 29.—French statesmen were deeply moved by President Roosevelt's speech outlining America's foreign viewpoint, the United Press was advised officially today.

"France agrees on every point, and is grateful for this evidence of a perfect communion of ideas," said Foreign Undersecretary Francois de Tesson after a thorough study of the speech in consultation with Premier Camille Chautemps and Foreign Minister Joseph Paul-Boncour. "M. Paul-Boncour was particularly moved and characterized the speech as magnificent."

Full Support Pledged
French government leaders were particularly pleased at the President's statement that 90 per cent of the world's people were satisfied with present national boundaries. They expressed pleasure also at his statement in favor of international control of armaments, which France makes an essential prelude to demobilization.

"Making an official statement in the name of the French government I am pleased to report France's happy reaction and full support of every point of the President's speech," said de Tesson.

Without adhering to the League of Nations, the United States now, by parallel action, supports the same doctrine of equality of nations, disarmament and armament control that French people have maintained.

Congratulations Sent President

"President Roosevelt and M. Paul Boncour are in complete agreement. Nothing stands between American and French foreign policies, except that we are members of the League of Nations and the United States is not. But even then, the United States proves it is as attached to the welfare of humanity as any member of the league."

French Ambassador Andre Delaunay will call at the state department in Washington to convey to the President the congratulations of Foreign Minister Joseph Paul-Boncour on the speech, it was revealed.

YOUTH, 20, HELD FOR KILLING OF DEAF GIRL

Seized After 2,000-Mile Flight; Confesses, Police Say.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 29.—A 20-year-old youth who purportedly confessed killing Margaret Peery, Michigan deaf-mute, was held in county jail here today, awaiting return to Grand Rapids to face murder charges.

William McMann was arrested in a local telegraph office last night at the end of a 2,000-mile flight from a corn field where he said he left the girl's bullet-pierced body. Police said he readily admitted killing her during a quarrel.

Solution to Previous Contract Problem

IT is true that many hands that you bid for game can be defeated, if the opponent can guess the killing opening. But that should not discourage your bidding.

When you receive an advantageous opening, you must pounce upon that opportunity and make the most of it.

Today's is a simple hand, but it brings out a good point in bidding and a simple point in play.

In the constructive system of bidding, when your partner assists your original bid with just one simple raise, he simply is advising you that he has four of your trump and two probable entry cards. One of them may be in trump.

In other words, it is just what might be termed a chance-giving bid.

Then again, he may have an intermediate hand, just between a two and a three bid.

Now, having found a fit with your partner, it is not always advisable to show that second suit, especially if it is a tenace suit and there is any chance of its being opened. I believe, with South's hand, that he is justified in taking the long chance and jumping the hand to four spades.

HOWEVER, West still opens the king of diamonds and continues with the queen of diamonds, which South ruffs with the ace of spades. His next play is a small spade, winning in dummy with the ten.

The declarer can see that, if West opened a club and continued with clubs, and if the queen of hearts is wrong, he is bound to lose a diamond, two hearts and a club. Therefore, as long as the club was not opened, he now must establish a long heart, on which to get a discard of a losing club. So a small heart is returned, and when

East refuses to go up with the ace, the ten is finessed and West wins with the queen.

West returns the ace of diamonds and South trumps with the king of spades. He then leads the queen of spades, following with the seven of spades, which is won in dummy. Now the nine of hearts is played. Of course, East wins with the ace and he is helpless. If he returns a diamond the declarer will discard a losing club and trump the diamond in dummy; if a club is returned, the declarer will win with the ace, play the king and jack of hearts, discarding a club from dummy, and the contract is made. 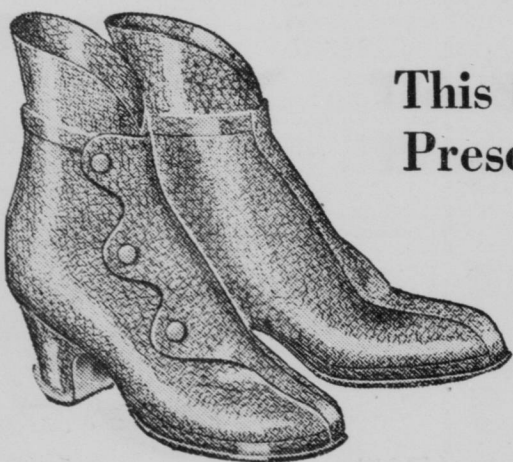
