CITY'S REACTION
OVER DILLINGEROfficials Suffer Criticism of
Business Women
and Men.Street corners buzzed today with
comments on the Dillinger escape.The general feeling vacillated
from amusement that a desperate
criminal had been allowed to "whittle"
in his jail cell, to expressions of derision and charges that "somebody's
palm had been greased heavily."Expressions obtained from a
number of shoppers and business
women hurrying along the downtown
streets brought the following
opinions:"The escape shows extreme care-
lessness on the part of officials who
became too familiar with known
criminals." —A. F. Austin, Mooney-
Mueller-Ward Drug Company.It seems to me that the entire
escape originated within the jail.
Dillinger just had too much
money." —Miss Katharine Drybread,
8 Argyle apartments."Well, he's gone, isn't he? No one
seems to know how." —A. E. Clash-
man, 106 West North street."He shouldn't have been allowed
to have had a knife and pieces of
wood in his cell. Then he couldn't
have had a toy gun." —Miss Jeanette
Tharp, 1271 West New York
street.Dick Collins, manager of A. G.
Spalding and Bros. asked "if there's
any truth in the statement that
Dillinger is now planning to take
over the marines."Then growing serious, he said,
"They were dealing with a criminal
with a lot of money. The wooden
gun never has been produced. I
suppose Dillinger told them if they'd
let him whittle, he'd clean up all
the scraps of wood, and keep the
cell neat?""If they would take away all hu-
man contact in dealing with a
criminal like Dillinger—send food
to him on an automatic food con-
veyor—there'd be no chance for an
escape.""Ridiculous! That's how I feel
about this escape," said Mrs. Eva
Hughes, 439 West New York street.
"There's been a lot of carelessness
—I don't know on whose part, but
it's evident.""Anybody that could get away
with a wooden pistol is entitled to
stay out," commented Abe Schwartz,
