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**FOGGY DEAN TRIAL
SET FOR APRIL 9**

Alleged Jones Slayer Is
Arraigned.

Edward (Foggy) Dean, one of the alleged members of the gang that killed Sergeant Lester Jones in the Peoples Coach Company holdup, was arraigned today in criminal court on charges of first degree murder and murder in commission of a robbery.

He pleaded not guilty and trial date was set by Criminal Judge Frank P. Baker for April 9.

The arraignment today was on new indictments brought down by a grand jury against Dean, Willie Mason and Ernest (Red) Giberson. Giberson escaped from the Hancock county jail. Mason was tried and the jury hung on the verdict.

Efforts will be made to try Mason again on the new indictment. Criminal court attaches say that the Hancock county court has refused to try Mason on the old indictment again.
