

LAWYERS BACK CANDIDACY OF RALPH SPAAN

G. O. P. Attorneys' Petition
Supports Aspirant to
Criminal Bench.

A petition supporting candidacy of Ralph M. Spaan for the Republican nomination for criminal court judge in the May primary has been signed by more than 100 prominent Republican attorneys of the city.

"Realizing that it is of vital importance to the welfare of the citizens of Marion county, Indiana, that a nominee who enjoys the unqualified confidence of the people shall be selected for judge of the Marion criminal court on the Republican ticket in the coming primary election," the petition states, "the Republican lawyers hereby express the conviction that Ralph M. Spaan is qualified by experience, ability and character admirably to serve the people of this county as judge of the Marion criminal court."

Congress Candidate

Don F. Roberts, attorney, will seek the Republican nomination for congress from the Eleventh district. He is a former judge advocate of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Indiana department.

Mr. Roberts lives in Lawrence, is married and has three children and a grandchild. He is a disabled war veteran, having lost his right leg at Dun Sur Meuse, France. Mr. Roberts in a statement said that he was against all codes and trusts except the moral code.


Assessor Candidate

Since that time he has resided in Indianapolis and has been identified with the Republican state committee.

Edward L. Dietz, attorney and former township official, will seek the Republican nomination for Center township justice of peace, he announced today. Mr. Dietz formerly was chief clerk of the Marion county circuit court and instructor at the Benjamin Harrison Law school.

He was admitted to the bar in 1912 and is a member of South Meridian Civic League, South Side Republican League and president of St. Joseph Cemetery Association.

Candidates Must Register

Warning that all candidates must register as legal voters before filing their candidacy was sent to county chairman and vice-chairman today from Democratic state headquarters. The warning followed ruling of the state election commissioners that only registered voters are entitled to file under the new law.
