

JEAN NASH'S SON FREED IN MURDER

Youth to Return With
Mother to France.

NEW YORK, April 3.—Accused of a charge of murder on the high seas, Andrew Donaldson Kirwan prepared today to return to France with his mother, the former Jean Nash, and his devoted stepfather, Paul Dubonnet, wealthy French vintner.

It was understood the youth would go to the Dubonnet villa on the French Riviera, where he would be treated for a nervous ailment. The jury decided in less than half an hour that Kirwan was not guilty of the fatal stabbing of Gilliam Sesoms aboard the liner President Garfield.
