OF 1,661 SUBSCRIBERS

Increase Reported for First Three Months of 1934.

A net gain of 1,661 subscribers during the first three months of 1934, as opposed to a loss of 6,797 during the same period last year, was announced by the Indiana Bell Telephone Company yesterday.

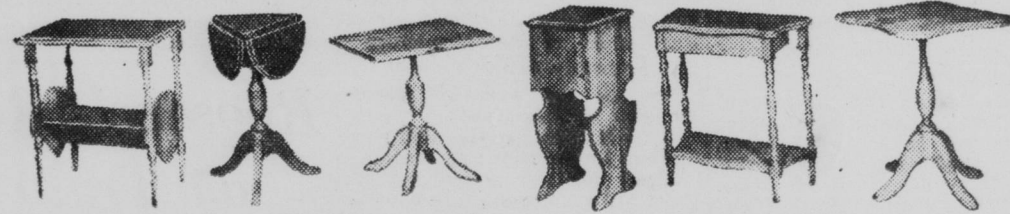
