

**MATHEMATICS
PROFESSOR AT
BUTLER DEAD**

Dr. Elijah N. Johnson, 69, Head of Department, Native Hoosier.

Dr. Elijah N. Johnson, 69, head of the mathematics department of Butler university, died yesterday afternoon at his home, 304 Downey avenue. He had been ill for four years.

Dr. Johnson was born in Willow Branch, Ind., and educated in Campbell, Drake, and Kansas State universities. In 1926, he was given an honorary degree of doctor of science by Butler university.

He formerly was chairman of the Indiana section of the American Mathematical Society. He was a member of the Central Association of Science and Mathematics Teachers, the Phi Kappa Psi fraternity, Phi Beta Kappa, and the Downey Avenue Christian church.

Dr. Johnson was treasurer of Butler university from 1924 to 1929, and had been a member of the faculty since 1904. He formerly was president of Campbell university, at Holton, Kan.

Surviving him are the widow, Mrs. Martha Johnson; a son, Richard Johnson, Chicago, and two brothers, the Rev. C. A. Johnson, Nacogdoches, Tex., and B. R. Johnson, Alco, Cal.

Funeral arrangements will not be completed until the son arrives.

Walter Pittsford Dead

Walter E. Pittsford, 51, Spink Arms, died early this morning, after an illness of two weeks. Until his retirement two years ago he was head of the Pittsford Purity Pie Company. He formerly was Indiana district governor of Rotary, and president of the Indianapolis Rotary Club.

Surviving him are the widow; three brothers, James Pittsford, Delavan, Ill.; Ben C. Pittsford, Chicago; and Marion J. Pittsford, Wheaton, Ill.; and a sister, Miss Edith M. Pittsford, Delavan.

Funeral services will be held in Indianapolis tomorrow morning, with burial in Muncie.

Mr. Von Oeyen was native of Germany, and had been a resident of Indianapolis seventeen years. He died yesterday in his home.
