

ROBLES RANSOM OFFER REFUSED BY KIDNAPERS

Girl's Father Says \$10,000 Is All He Can Raise; No Reply Heard.

TUCSON, Ariz., May 11.—Fernando Robles' plea to kidnapers of his 6-year-old daughter, June, to accept \$10,000 ransom money in exchange for her release apparently fell upon deaf ears today.

Mr. Robles said he had received no reply to his public appeal to the abductors to release his daughter, kidnapped sixteen days ago as she was returning from school.

Bowed with grief, he said he had no assurance she would be returned safely and feared he will "never see the baby again" unless her captors

were content to reduce their original ransom demands for \$15,000. The \$10,000 the electrical shop keeper offered, is all he can raise, he said.
