4 ARE HELD IN FAKE BILL CASE

Hoosier Quartet Is Linked
With \$250,000 Seizure
in Chicago.

SOUTH BEND, Ind., June 15.—Four men accused of flooding northern Indiana with counterfeit five-dollar bills were held here today for arraignment in federal district court.

Federal agents who for six months have sought the source of the spurious notes hinted that arrest in Ft. Wayne yesterday of one of the four, Orville Boyer, 41, had given them a clue leading to Chicago and Indianapolis.
Bills confiscated have been of the same issue as those in a \$250,000 seizure in Chicago several months ago.
Boyer, with Floyd Overmyer of Marion, and Jess White and Harry

Houser of Ft. Wayne, was indicted Monday by a grand jury.
Charles Mazy, secret service agent with headquarters in Indianapolis, was assigned to the case.
