

MADAME CURIE WILL BE BURIED NEAR HUSBAND

World Mourns Passing of
Radium Expert; France
Plans Honors.

PARIS, July 5.—All the world today mourned the passing of Marie Curie, co-discoverer of radium, one of the greatest of modern scientists, and one of the greatest women of all time.

While her body was being brought back to Paris from the Savoy Alps, where she died yesterday, a movement was under way to bury her and her husband in the Pantheon, which France is to England.

Physicians said that the woman whose discoveries saved untold lives and allayed the sufferings of thousands, died a martyr to science.

Mme. Curie will be buried first beside the simple grave of her husband, Pierre Curie, in a suburban cemetery. Curie died in 1906. If later both bodies are transferred to the Pantheon, it will be the greatest honor France ever bestowed upon a foreigner. Mme. Curie was a Pole by birth, although she spent almost all her adult years in Paris.

The government indicated it would continue to subsidize the Curie institute which it established and financed on condition Mme. Curie would be its director and supervise research devoted entirely to application of radium in the treatment of cancer and other tissue diseases.

**PREMIER IS EXCUSED
FROM PAYING \$15,000**

Canadian Supreme Court Denies
Damages for Seduction.

EDMONTON, Alberta, July 5.—Prime Minister John E. Brownlee today was excused from paying \$15,000 damages for seduction.

Setting aside a jury verdict favoring Vivian MacMillan, 22, and her father, the Alberta supreme court ruled neither had a right to action because seduction had not interfered with Miss MacMillan's ability to serve her father or serve herself.

Brownlee's resignation, presented to the lieutenant-governor of Alberta, had not yet been accepted. It was not known if the court action would have any bearing on his political fate.


