

## 50 NEW AGENTS ARE ADDED TO FEDERAL FORCE

100 More Will Be Taken on Soon to Fight Crime, Cummings Says.

WASHINGTON, July 6.—The department of justice, continuing its determined offensive against crime, has added fifty new agents under the additional fund granted by the last congress, Attorney-General Homer S. Cummings said today.


As rapidly as qualified men can be found, it is expected that the force of 450 federal agents will be increased to more than 600.

The new men will be sent into the field as soon as they have completed a thorough training period, including marksmanship courses in use of machine guns, high-powered rifles and other weapons.

A large part of the present force is concentrated in the hunt for desperado John Dillinger and his remaining fugitive lieutenants.

The first case arising under the new crime laws passed by congress, Mr. Cummings said, was the robbery of the Morris County bank at Na-

pies, Tex., on July 2. Federal agents and local authorities have arrested Grover Manes, alleged to have been one of the robbers, and Alma Bohanon, an alleged accomplice. Mr. Cummings said Julius Bohanon and Robert Lee Custer also had been identified as participants in the robbery.

Ft. Harrison Trainees Awake to Early Bugle Call at Camp.

## Indiana in Brief

\$52,000 Deal Voted

NEWCASTLE, July 6.—City council has adopted a resolution authorizing lease of a 50-kilowatt engine, generator and auxiliary equipment for the municipally owned electric plant. The lease involves expenditure of \$52,000.

The transaction is in reality a purchase, the lease form of buying being resorted to as a means of avoiding issuance of bonds. It is contemplated that the \$52,000 will be paid from earnings of the plant, thus imposing no burden on tax-payers.

## CITY MAN HELD AS BIGAMIST ON BRIDE'S CHARGE

Failed to Wait on Divorce

Jerry O'Neal, 26, was a resident of the city prison today because, police charge, he got married twice in six months without the necessary intervening divorce.

O'Neal was arrested yesterday on a warrant sworn out by Mrs. Lillian O'Neal, 27, described by police as the second wife. He was seized as he stepped off a Chicago bus after a jaunt to Chicago on funds supplied, according to police, by the second Mrs. O'Neal.

Police say he married his second bride June 23, one day after Mrs. Pauline Sprouse O'Neal, 618 East Vermont street, had filed suit for divorce against him in superior court here. The date of the first O'Neal marriage is set by police at Dec. 26.

The second Mrs. O'Neal, whose first husband died two years ago, leaving her with a small business and a 6-year-old son, told police she met O'Neal ten weeks ago when he

was working as a laundry truck driver.

She said they were married in Louisville, Ky., and went to St. Louis, Mo., on their honeymoon at her expense. She bought him an auto as a gift, she added.

She said he reported losing his job because he had been robbed and she added she had kept him financed until Saturday morning, when he took the car and left, saying he had found another job.

That night when he failed to return, Mrs. O'Neal looked around, she said. She discovered, according to police, that O'Neal already was married, that the car was in a downtown garage, and that O'Neal had gone to Chicago.


