

LOUIS LATHROP, RETIRED CITY BANKER, DEAD

Indianapolis Resident of 35 Years Was Prominent in Clubs.

Louis E. Lathrop, 72, the Marott, died last night of heart disease. He was a retired banker and business man, and had lived in Indianapolis thirty-five years.

He was senior partner of the firm of Lathrop & Haueisen dealers in bonds and securities, and later became president of the National Title Company.

Mr. Lathrop was a trustee of the Second Presbyterian church, and a member of the University, Indianapolis Athletic and Indianapolis Country clubs.

Surviving him are a niece, Mrs. Russell J. Ryan, and a nephew, Ferdinand L. Mayer.
