Children Adopt Fathers' Alibis as Pastime Gains Popularity.

Children of 12—and children even younger—can blame their tardiness to supper on the same game which their fathers blame.

"I'm sorry, Mom," they can say with the utmost candor, "but I got in the rough on that tough seventh and it took a heck of a long time to get out."

For Miss Alma Teifert, recreation supervisor, has brought to the city playgrounds a new game called sandpile golf. The sport follows the rules of regular golf, the exceptions being that wooden paddles are used for clubs and a sponge rubber ball replaces the golf ball.

Course Is Nine Holes

At all the playgrounds, the children have worked to build sand traps, rough and other hazards. The average playground course consists of nine holes.

Although the age limit for sandpile golf is 12, Miss Teifert claims that many older children have clamored for the privilege of making their own courses.

In planning the tournament for the juvenile golfers, the ingenious recreation supervisor has discovered a plan to prevent alibying for poor scores.

Each sandpile golfer will get three chances to play. The lowest score made will be recorded as the final score. So, if a golfer gets into difficulty on one round he has two more chances to redeem himself.
