

STATE FAIR TO MOVE OFFICES

Additional Space Needed to
Take Care of Increased
Concession Sales.

Crowded conditions at the state fair general offices as the fair date approaches today necessitated moving the headquarters from the statehouse to the administration building at the grounds.

Hiring of additional employees as well as the greatly increased sale of concession space is responsible for the move, according to officials. More space has been sold already this year than was sold at fair time last year.

Lieutenant-Governor M. Clifford Townsend, under whose supervision the fair will be operated, will maintain his offices at the statehouse, but will be represented at the fair-ground by his secretary, Dick Heller.

Aug. 15 is the deadline for entries, officials warn.

Industrial committees have been named by thirty-five Indiana counties to co-operate with state fair officials in planning their counties' exhibits for fair week, Sept. 1 to 7.

Committeemen will be guests at a dinner given by the Indiana agriculture board at the Indianapolis Athletic Club at 6:30 Monday.

Lieutenant-Governor Townsend will advise them of plans for the fair.

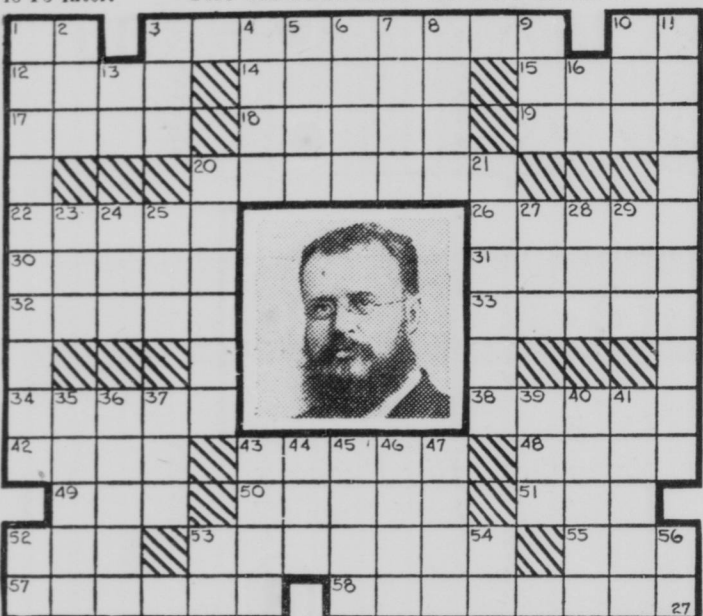

BUDGET HIKED BY INSTITUTION

Central Hospital Requests
\$514,388 Increase for
Fiscal Period.

An increase of \$514,388 for the biennial budget of the Central State hospital is sought in requests filed yesterday by the institution trustees with Ed Brennan, budget clerk.

A construction and repair program aggregating \$426,066 accounts for most of the petitioned increase. Included in the program are a \$175,000 men's cottage with 100-patient capacity and a \$210,000 men's cottage with 160-patient capacity.

The trustees seek \$670,616 for 1935-36 and \$669,550 for 1936-37. The 1933-34 budget was \$421,778 and the 1934-35 budget \$404,000.

Budget requests first are acted on by the budget committee and then incorporated in the biennial appropriation bill for legislative approval. Increases to \$87,898 a year for each of the two fiscal years are sought by the state industrial board. The amounts authorized by the 1933 legislature were \$78,100 for each year. The increases are for additions in contractual costs and purchase of new equipment.
