Funeral for City Merchant
Tailor to Be Held
Tomorrow.

Funeral services for Edward A. Becker, 43, of 2459 College avenue, who died at his home yesterday, will be held at 9:30 tomorrow at the Planner & Buchanan mortuary. Burial will be in Crown Hill.

Mr. Becker, a lifelong resident of Indianapolis, was widely known in merchant tailoring circles. He was a World war veteran and was a member of the Scottish Rite, Oriental lodge, F. & A. M. and McVaine-Kothe Post, American Legion.
