CITY HOSPITAL NURSE SCHOOL TO ENROLL 37

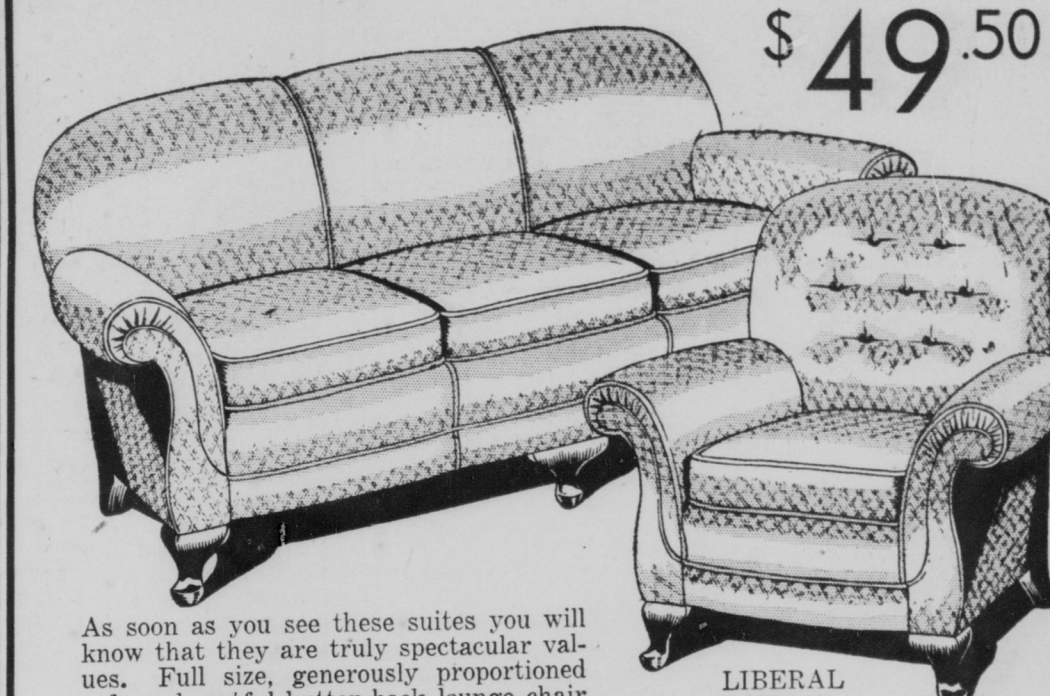
Three Basic Courses Are Offered; Local Students in List.

Thirty-seven preliminary student nurses will be enrolled in the fall semester beginning today at the Indianapolis city hospital school of nursing. Indianapolis students enrolling include Misses Evelyn Hurtt, Martha Johnson, Marie Koch, Ruth Landy, Betty Loscent, Vivian Mewborn, Virginia Soltan, Gladys Stevens and Mary Wesner. The program of study, which is planned on an academic basis, offers a three-basic course which leads to a diploma in nursing. Through a co-operative plan of study with Butler university, a student may receive a diploma in nursing and a bachelor of science degree in five years and four months. Registration by the state of Indiana and the New York board of regents is maintained by the school. The school offers opportunities in

medical, surgical, gynecological, neuropsychiatric, orthopedic, obstetrical and pediatric services. The research department, under the direction of the Eli Lilly laboratories for clinical research, provides opportunity for supervised special work for senior student nurses with patients in the research ward. Affiliation of the city hospital school with the Indiana university school of medicine brings student nurses in contact with the teaching staff of the medical school, affording advantage of practical instruction by the teaching staff.
