Former Banker, 91, Veteran of Civil War, Dies at City Home.

Funeral services for Charles V. Chandler, 91, of 3548 Kenwood avenue, who died at his home Sunday night after a six months illness, were to be held this afternoon in Macomb, Ill. Burial also will be there.

Mr. Chandler, a Civil war veteran was born in Macomb and was active in the banking business there until twenty years ago when he retired and removed to Indianapolis. During the Civil war he was wounded at Chickamauga.

He was the oldest living alumnus of Lake Forest college, Lake Forest, Ill., and was one of the oldest veterans in Indianapolis.

Survivors are two daughters, Miss Mary Chandler, Indianapolis, and Miss Isabel Mapes, Chicago; two sons, George Chandler, with whom he lived and Ralph Chandler, Chicago; four grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.
