

STATE PARLEY OF OSTEOPATHS OPENS IN CITY

Election of Officers Held
Group to Hear Noted
Speakers.

The Indiana Osteopathic Association today began its annual convention at the Lincoln, with election of officers and a speech by Dr. Russell C. McCaughan, Chicago, American Osteopathic Association executive secretary, as highlights in the day's schedule.

Dr. C. B. Blakeslee, R. R. 17, Box 188B, was elected president. Other officers chosen were Wesley Warner, Ft. Wayne, vice-president, and Dr. Elizabeth Crain, Richmond, and Dr. Charles M. Eccles, Connersville, trustees. The trustees re-elected Fred L. Swope, Richmond, as secretary, and Dr. Kate Williams, 519 Sutherland avenue, as treasurer.

Dr. Walter S. Grow, 4240 Park avenue, was re-elected delegate to the American Osteopathic Association, and A. D. Caine, Marion, named as his alternate.

Dr. McCaughan, a native of Kokomo, who formerly was active in the state organization, will discuss "State Medicine" at the annual banquet tonight at the Lincoln. The officers were to be elected earlier in the day.

Following the dinner, a technical session will be conducted by members of the Chicago College of Osteopathy faculty, including Dr. E. R. Hoskins, roentgenologist, who will demonstrate reading of full-view X-ray photographs.

"More than a million dollars a day is being spent in tax-supported hospitals to care for dementia praecox patients," according to a paper by Dr. Arthur G. Hildreth, Macon, Mo., former American Osteopathic Association president, which was read at the opening session of the two-day convention this morning.

"According to osteopathic principles, bad body mechanics are the basic underlying cause in undermining health and often lead to the borderline case and even to pronounced insanity itself," Dr. Hildreth's message said.

Following another scientific session tomorrow, Dr. McCaughan will speak at 1 tomorrow afternoon on "Economic Trend in Practice." Convention visitors will then be conducted on a trip through the Eli Lilly & Co. plant while the osteopaths' wives and families will visit the Scottish Rite Cathedral.

Members of the nominating committee, which reported this morning, were Drs. J. B. Kinsinger, Rushville; J. E. Baker, Brazil; A. B. Caine, Marion; L. E. Browne, Ft. Wayne, and Paul Van B. Allen, Indianapolis.

PICCARDS TO STUDY STRATOSPHERE DATA

Instruments Unharmed in 10-Mile Flight.

CADIZ, O., Oct. 24.—Jean and Jeannette Piccard, recovered from a

balloon ascension that took them ten miles above the earth's surface, packed their dozens of scientific instruments today, confident their flight would contribute much new knowledge concerning the nature of the stratosphere and cosmic rays. Their instruments were unharmed in a rough landing near here yesterday. The huge balloon that lifted them in their global gondola from the earth at Dearborn (Mich.) airport yesterday morning had been ripped to shreds by sightseers

and souvenir hunters. The gondola was not badly damaged. Both the Piccards considered the flight a great success. They fell short of equaling the altitude record by at least a mile and a half.
