M'NUTT, KERN TO SPEAK AT CITY MEETING

Governor, Mayor Candidate on Fourteenth Ward Program.

Governor Paul V. McNutt will re-enter the Marion county campaign tonight by making an address at a Fourteenth ward meeting in Barkin's hall, Warren and Oliver avenues.

H. Nathan Swaim, former county chairman, will preside. Speakers in addition to Governor McNutt will be Superior Judge John W. Kern, Democratic nominee for mayor, and Chalmers Schlosser.

Judge Baker to Speak

Criminal Judge Frank P. Baker, candidate for re-election; Superior Judge John W. Kern, Democratic nominee for mayor, and Miss Hannah Noone, Center township trustee, will speak at a Nineteenth ward meeting at King avenue and Walnut street tonight.

Other Democratic meetings scheduled tonight will be at 2405 Northwestern avenue; Nineteenth street and Cornell avenue, and at Colorado avenue and New York street.

Ludlow Heads Program

The Washington township Democratic campaign will end tonight with an address by Louis Ludlow, Twelfth district representative, in Hoffman's hall, 4517 Keystone avenue.

Charles D. Myers will preside. Other speakers will be Circuit Judge Earl R. Cox; Mrs. Maggie Maxwell, nominee for Washington township trustee; John S. Newhouse, candidate for county commissioner, and Carl Sobbe, Washington township assessor nominee.

Wayne Hears Peters

Election of the entire Democratic ticket was urged last night by R. Earl Peters, defeated candidate for the United States senate, in a Wayne township Democratic rally at Ben Davis high school. Otto Ray, Democratic sheriff nominee, promised to restore the road patrol, if elected. An automobile parade more than three miles long preceded the rally.

Flays City Administration

Walter Pritchard, Republican nominee for mayor, charged last night that claims of economy for the present Democratic city administration are not borne out by the records.

Speaking at a Republican rally at the Riviera Club, Illinois street and the canal, the Coffin candidate termed the financial practices of the administration "unsound" and declared that its excellent showing had been obtained by issuing bonds to pay current operating expenses.

Harrison Is Praised

William Henry Harrison, Republican nominee for prosecuting attorney, owes no favors to any so-called political machine; Alvah J. Rucker, former prosecutor, declared last night at a Republican rally at 126 North Pennsylvania street. He appealed to voters to disregard party affiliations in seeking a prosecutor.
