# ENGLAND'S NEW

## INSURANCE FOR

### JOBLESS BEGINS

Able-Bodied Wage-Earners  
Guaranteed Money by  
Government.

LONDON, Jan. 8.—Great Britain today permanently assumed the full care and maintenance of every able-bodied wage earner in the country (whether insured or not) who is earning normally less than \$25 a week.

About 17,000,000 wage earners, representing more than 34,000,000 people out of a population of 45,000,000 passed under the care of the Unemployment Assistance Board, which opened its doors at Thomas House.

The 17,000,000 wage earners are guaranteed Government assistance for an indefinite period when they are out of a job—in cash, as a matter of right and decency, with no poor law stigma attached.

The only restrictions are that they must be between 16 and 65 years of age, make real efforts to find work and must normally earn less than \$25 a week. The board starts work with a Government deposit in the Bank of England of \$25,000. The bulk of the money is a bookkeeping transfer of funds which have been handled hitherto by local authorities.

# U. S. TAX COLLECTIONS

## \$32,848,176 IN STATE

1.23 Per Cent of Federal Income  
Taken in Indiana.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8.—Federal tax collections for Indiana for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1934, amounted to \$32,848,176, the annual report of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue disclosed this afternoon.

Of this sum, \$8,916,842.17 came from income tax collections, \$18,024,215.40 from miscellaneous internal revenues and \$5,738,919.07 from agricultural adjustment tax collections.

Using the 1930 census figures, the bureau points out that Indiana's population represents 2.63 per cent of the United States total. The Federal tax payments represented 1.23 per cent of the \$2,672,239,104.52 collected in 1934.

# PLANE PLUNGES INTO

## TROOPS; 11 ARE KILLED

Army Ship Dives Into Platoon During Air Maneuvers.

KARACHI, India, Jan. 8.—Eleven Indian soldiers were killed and 11 were seriously injured today when an Indian air force plane nosedived into a platoon of troops manuevering near the Hub River.

The airplane, practicing a machine gun dive, failed to straighten out as it neared the ground and swooped into the platoon, belonging to the Fourth Baluch Regiment.

The men were bowled over like ten-pins. They were crushed under the plane, which left a path of maimed and dying men in its wake. The airplane was wrecked and the pilot and observer slightly injured.
