

# LOCAL OPTION IS OPPOSED BY BEER DEALERS

State Association Drafts  
Platform for Strict  
Regulation.

Indiana members of the Retail Beverage Dealers' Association of America will declare themselves opposed to local option liquor law of any sort, the executive board announced here yesterday.

Wilbur A. Royce, association attorney, announced the following planks in the organization platform for strict regulation of the industry: A reduction of the tax on hard liquor to not more than 5 cents a pint; single license for retailers who handle both malt and distilled beverages; a strict penalty for sale of liquor to minors and passage of a measure making it a misdemeanor for minors to obtain liquor by falsely representing their age.

The group desires a state-wide closing law, closing all establishments from 1 a. m. to 6 a. m. daily and from 2 a. m. to 1 p. m. on Sunday.

"This program, if adopted, will keep the retail liquor business on a high plane and aid greatly in abolishing the bootlegger," said Richard Stegemeier, organization chairman.

Executive board members attending the session were Edward N. Koehler, Harry B. Mahan, William Youngman, William O'Haver, Samuel Barrington, J. Ed Burk and Thomas Buskirk, Indianapolis; Robert Rice, Brazil; Garland Stephens, Evansville, and J. P. Vollmecke, Terre Haute.

## Lobbyists Register

The Indiana Bituminous Coal Operators Association and the Retail Beverage Dealers Association of America have registered lobbyists in the office of the Secretary of State for the General Assembly.

Harvey Cartwright and Henry Adamson, both of Terre Haute, will represent the coal operators, and Wilbur A. Royce, Indianapolis, will look after the special interests of the retail liquor dealers. Ten organizations have filed petitions to lobby in this session thus far.

## Employment Service

State participation in a nationwide employment service is provided in a bill offered in the House of Representatives by Rep. Edward P. Barry (D., Indianapolis). The Governor's Commission on Unemployment Relief would act as the state's co-operating agency under the Wagner-Peyser Act.

The Barry bill provides for annual appropriations equal to the amount allotted by the Federal Government.

## Open Season on Foxes

There would be no closed season on fox hunting in several Indiana counties under the terms of a bill introduced in the House of Representatives by Rep. Glenn R. Slenker (D., Monticello).

The measure is intended to permit farmers whose poultry flocks are invaded by foxes to kill them at any time. Counties affected are Warren, Tippecanoe, Clinton, Tipton, Grant, Blackford and Jay.

In all other counties the fox season would be between Feb. 10 and Nov. 10.

## Chattel Mortgage Filing

All chattel mortgages issued under the bulk sales law would be filed in the offices of county recorders under the provisions of a bill introduced in the House of Representatives by Rep. I. Emory Carter (D., Fairmount) and Rep. Dan O. Gettinger (D., Sullivan).

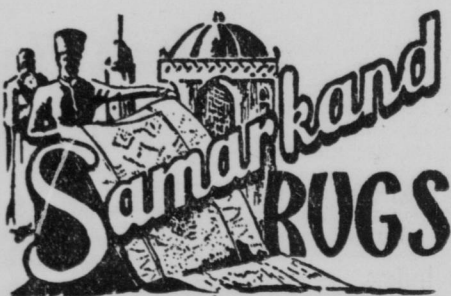

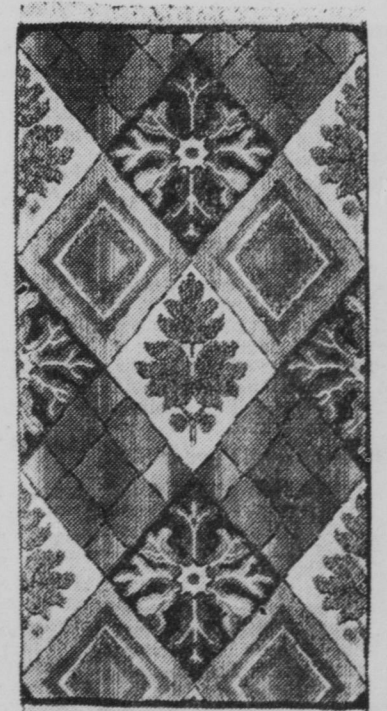
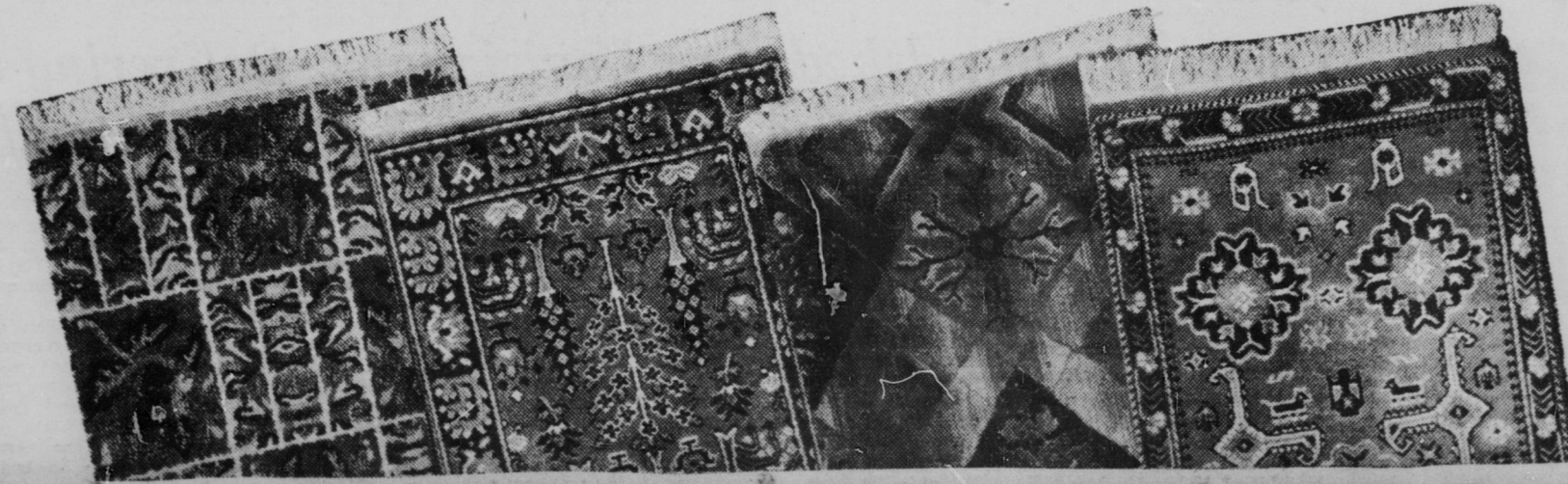
