

DRIVE IS BEGUN TO HIKE COUNTY OFFICERS' PAY

Uniform Salary Bill Is Prepared for Study by Assembly.

The upward drive of salaries for county officials began today as an administration bill was prepared for introduction in the General Assembly.

The new uniform bill is to be a substitute for the 1933 law, which was passed under suspension of the rules and which reduced the salaries of most county officials.

County recorders and county treasurers of the state propose new salary schedules.

Bills involving these two offices will be held in committee pending preparation of the uniform state salary measure.

The first step to hold down state budgets was taken yesterday in the Senate when a bill was presented to extend for another two years the act suspending the 2-cent educational building levy.

Unless the extension act is passed, the levy will become operative in 1935 and 1936 and require \$1,440,000 for new construction at Indiana and Purdue Universities and Indiana State and Ball State Teachers' Colleges.

AGENCY TAKES OVER GIBSON REFRIGERATORS

\$282,516 SAVED RATE PAYERS BY UTILITY SLASH

Voluntary Reduction for Northern Indiana Is Approved.

Voluntary rate reductions providing annual savings of \$282,516 for 56,600 electric consumers of the Northern Indiana Power Company and the Traction Light and Power Company were approved today by the Public Service Commission.

More than 200 cities, small towns and rural communities in 40 counties will be affected. The new schedules were made retroactive to Jan. 1.

The new rates are similar to those placed in effect last summer by the Public Service Company of Indiana which resulted in annual savings of approximately \$200,000 to electric consumers in southern Indiana.

The three utilities and the Northern Indiana Public Service Company comprise the operating units of the Midland United group, formerly owned by the Insull corporation.

Approval of the reductions by the commission today established uniform residential and rural rates in every section of the state served by the Midland group except the extreme northern region served by the Northern Indiana Public Service Company.

Approval of the latter company's petition for similar rates is awaited from the Public Service Commission following a hearing held Jan. 21.

The new rates affect Clinton, Greencastle, Martinsville, Huntington, Kokomo, Noblesville, Sullivan, Wabash and numerous small towns and communities in their vicinities.

FINAL DETROIT BANK DIVIDEND ORDERED

Depositors Having \$1000 or More Affected by Plan.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—Plans for payment of a "final dividend" to the large depositors of the closed Guardian National Bank of Commerce of Detroit, were announced yesterday by J. F. T. O'Connor, controller of currency.

The small depositors up to \$1000 have been paid 100 per cent, a total of \$10,162,000.

Under the new plan depositors above this sum will receive a "final dividend" of 19 per cent, bringing their total payments to 87 per cent. The "final dividend" will represent \$17,708,000.
