

BANDITS ELUDE POLICE SEARCH; LOOT IS \$925

Armed Pair Escapes After
Raid on Downtown
Furniture Store.

Two bandits, who yesterday held up the Victor Furniture Co., 231 W. Washington-st., and obtained approximately \$925, today had apparently made good their escape.

Both of the bandits were about 35 and wore dark overcoats and light gray hats. They produced automatic pistols after they had been in the store several minutes, and forced employees and two customers into a small office at the

rear of the store. While the employees huddled there, afraid to move, the bandits looted the cashier's office and took about \$25 from Guy Scanning, 53, of 3422 N. Capitol-av., a salesman. After warning the group in the office, "Don't move or you'll get shot," the bandits left by the Washington-st. entrance. Police squads quickly concentrated in a search of the immediate neighborhood, believing that the men had no car with them at the store. The search proved fruitless and no trace of the men has yet been found.

Robert Stern, store manager, 2152 N. Meridian-st., estimated that the bandits escaped with approximately \$900 in cash, which was being prepared for deposit at the time of the robbery.

SUN DIFFUSES RAINBOW HUES IN DUST STORM

City Observes Phenomenon
Traced to Wind-Swept
Drought Areas.

Migratory dust from the western plains obscured the sun late yesterday and today in Indianapolis. Yesterday the dust caused it to shed orange, red and blue sunlight. It would do the same today if the sky would be cleared of clouds. Millions upon millions of tiny dust particles, blown to a great height in a gale that swished over the drought region, were borne along

on a high wind over the Middle West. The Weather Bureau was deluged with calls from persons who were disturbed by the presence of a blue sun in the heavens. Some reported the blue was so distinct that it was as though some one had turned on a huge blue electric lamp in the sky. Others reported red and orange sunlight and called the bureau to find out if everything was all right. There have been no reports in Indianapolis that any of the dust settled to the ground.
