

COMMITTEE IS APPOINTED BY BUTLER ALUMNI

Three City Men Among Six Named to Executive Group of Body.

John L. Fuller, president of the Butler University Alumni Association, has announced appointment of Rev. Carl H. Barnett, Lebanon, Eural Byfield and Austin Clifford of Indianapolis to the executive committee of the organization for 1935-36.

Other members of the committee are Frank Brown, Howard C. Caldwell, and Miss Sarah T. Sisson. Mr. Barnett is a member of the class of 1910. Mr. Clifford was graduated in 1917 and Mr. Byfield in 1924.

Debating Trials Start

Try-outs for members of the Butler University varsity debate squads have started under direction of Charles H. Walters, debate coach. Forty candidates reported for the two squads.

Prof. Walters has announced that Butler will participate in approxi-

mately twenty-five intercollegiate meets this season, among them being the annual tournament at North Manchester College in March.

Plant Specimens Received

The Butler University herbarium has received 300 specimens of plants from northern Michigan as the result of a gift by Dr. John E. Potzger, instructor in botany, who spent several days last summer doing plant research on Mackinac and Round Islands in the Straits of Mackinac.

RICHMOND, Ind., Oct. 14.—The Rev. F. M. Hanes Anderson, has been chosen as pastor of the Second English Lutheran Church, officers announced. He is to succeed the Rev. L. Herbert Wyandt, who has been named Civilian Conservation Corps chaplain at Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Indianapolis.

BANKS REFLECT BETTER TIMES, GOVERNOR SAYS

Increased Deposits Show Return of Prosperity, McNutt Declares.

Indiana banks and building loan associations were termed "weather-vanes of returning prosperity" today by Gov. McNutt, as he told of increased deposits in state banks. The address also was broadcast last night.

"Time deposits," he said, "in 427 banks under state control are \$3,000,000 more today than a year ago and savings and thrift deposits total \$99,749,000 as against \$74,687,000 a year ago."

Return of Prosperity Shown

"Definite indication of a return to prosperity is reflected in the condition of Indiana financial institutions. Total resources for the fiscal year ending June 30 in Indiana amount to \$373,017,518.10 or an increase of \$61,000,000 in resources over June 30, 1934."

But one bank closed during the last year, caused by defalcations of a cashier, he said. Depositors

were paid off by Federal Deposit Insurance.

"Today there is not a single bank in Indiana operating on a restricted basis. At one time during the last two years 132 restricted banks, with \$8,000,000 in frozen deposits, were in operation. Four million dollars of the frozen deposits of those banks have been released."

Loan Association Resources Drop

The state, he pointed out, has 375 building and loan associations, with total resources of \$215,000,000, compared to \$246,000,000 in resources the previous year.

"Lending of credit unions in Indiana has more than doubled during the last three and one-half years. Loans outstanding June 30, 1935, were \$751,957.94 as compared with approximately \$325,000 on Dec. 31, 1932."

Total assets of the 113 credit unions in the state was \$1,114,156.59 at the end of the fiscal year compared to assets of \$630,367 in the previous year, the Governor declared in conclusion.

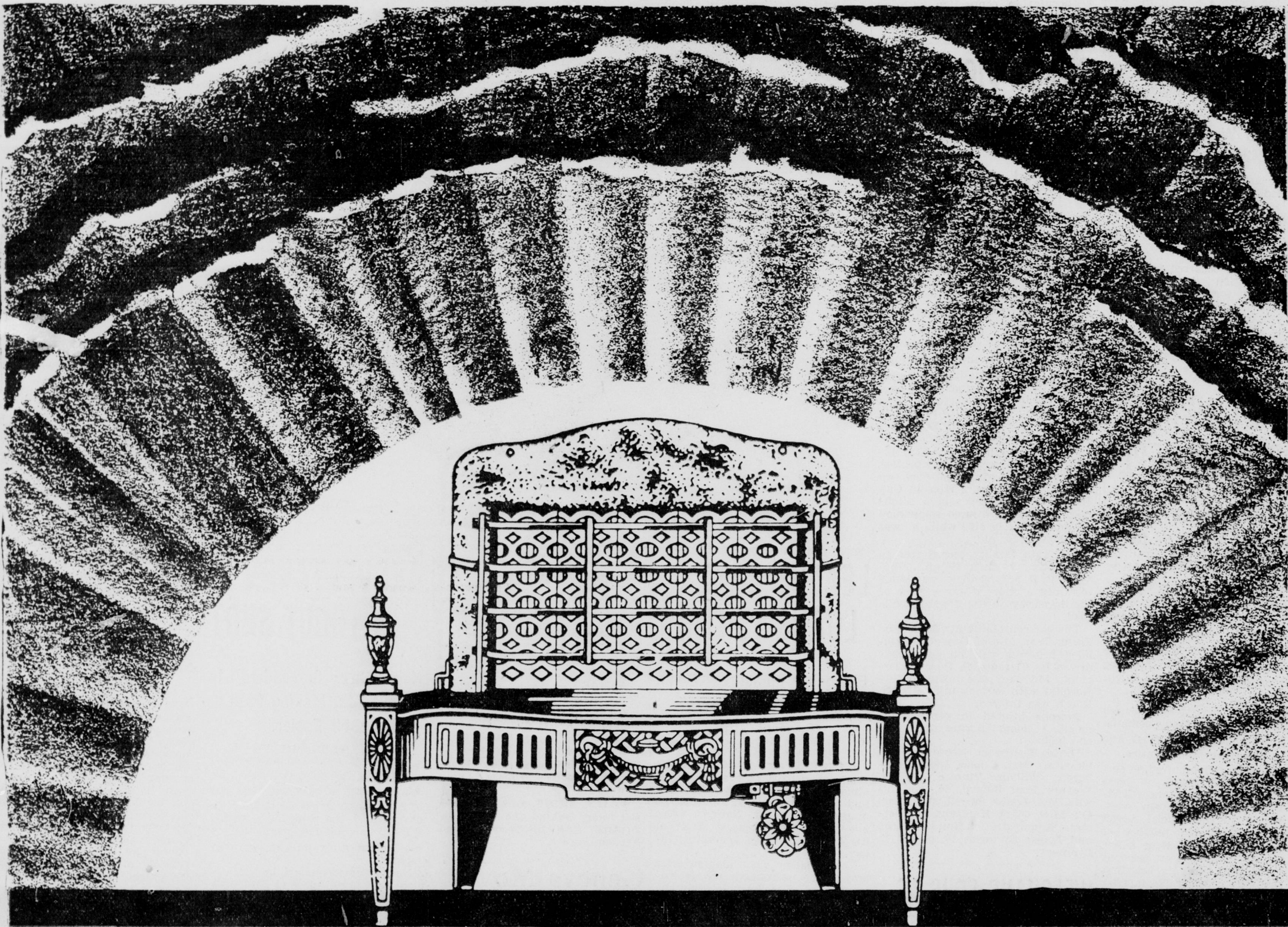

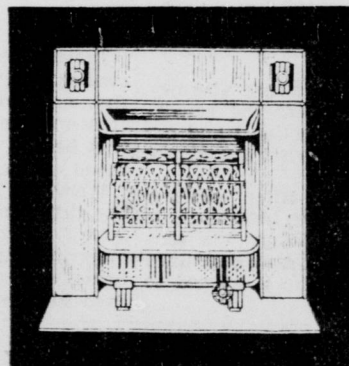

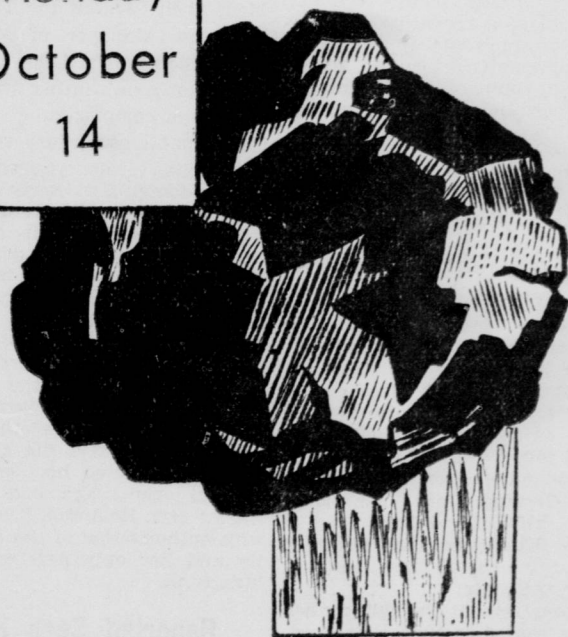
