

CRASH INJURIES KILL PAOLI MAN; 125TH FATALITY

Carl Kibler Dies in Hospital;
Another Victim Is
Ft. Wayne Man.

Carl Kibler, 42, Paoli, Ind., died this afternoon in Methodist Hospital of injuries received in an automobile accident here Oct. 25.

Both legs were broken and he received severe head injuries when his coupe crashed head-on into a truck in the 4500 block, English-av. The truck was driven by John H. Sweder, 34, of 206 Parkview-av.

Mr. Kibler's death is the 125th traffic fatality in Marion County since Jan. 1.

Ft. Wayne Man Killed

Marshall Isaacs, 25, Ft. Wayne, was killed here in an auto accident yesterday.

One hundred twenty-fourth in Marion County traffic this year, compared to 109 at this date last year.

His car struck the abutment of the Pennsylvania Railroad at S.

Emerson-av and died instantly. Police were unable to get details of the crash.

Ft. Wayne, is in City Hospital, both described as in fair condition. Both were victims of the same accident.

Isaac De Pew, 82, of 133½ N. Noble-st, is in City Hospital in a fair condition with injuries he received when he was involved in an auto accident yesterday at New York and Noble-sts. Three others were injured less seriously in two other accidents at the same corner.

Dr. William E. Davis, 1206 E. Washington-st, received an injury to his shoulder in an accident yesterday at New York and Rural-sts.

Charles Conroy, 19, of 1001 W. 29th-st, went back to work at an ice station at 30th-st and Barnes-av to-day convinced that a voyage with Admiral Byrd would be a "push-over."

After two Negro bandits had robbed him of \$20 yesterday noon they bound and gagged him with tape and locked him in the ice room.

"I spent five hours in there flopping around like a fish to keep warm," he said. "All I had on was a thin pair of work pants and a shirt. The temperature goes below 35. Don't tell me it wouldn't be a cinch to go to the Antarctic—those guys wear fur suits."

Two customers finally released him and called police. Taken to the City Hospital, he was put to bed

with a dozen hot water bottles and made to drink a quart of hot coffee.

MASON, DEAN CAPTORS WILL BE WITNESSES

Kentucky Officers Take
Stand Tomorrow in
Murder Case.

The captures of William (Willie) Mason and Edward (Foggy) Dean, charged with physical injury during the commission of a robbery, is to be described in Criminal Court tomorrow by Kentucky police officers.

Identified as two of the five gunmen who killed Police Sgt. Lester Jones in the Peoples Motor Coach Co. garage holdup Feb. 7, 1933, Mason and Dean face life imprisonment if convicted.

Last week, Patrolman Michael McAllen testified that Dean was the machine gunner who killed Sgt. Jones, and Mason as one of the men he had engaged in a gun battle at the garage.

Ernest (Red) Giberson, George Schwartz, alias Murphy, and Fred Adams now are serving life terms in

the Indiana State Prison in connection with the holdup.

Two taxi company employees, Paul Luthers and Harold Butts, have identified Mason and Dean as two of the bandits who commanded their cab at 17th-st and Carrollton-av a short time after the stickup.
