RENAME LINDER  
COUNTY LAWYER**

Ruse Refuses to Quit Post  
as Head of  
Infirmary.

John Linder today resumes his duties as county attorney, having been reappointed yesterday by the County Commissioners. Immediately after Clarence I. Wheatley was sworn to office as the new Board member.

Other reappointments are Harry Barret as superintendent of the Hospital of the Incurable Insane, Julietta and Anna E. Pickard as superintendent of the Juvenile Detention Home.

Sheldon Key, Andrew J. Hoover, William McGill and Benjamin Osborne, Negro, received appointments as old-age pension investigators.

**Freije Replaces Pierson**

Fred Freije, 3704½ E. Michigan St., became the bailiff of the Commissioners' Court, replacing Verl Pierson, Beech Grove, who was ousted because of his activities in Beech Grove elections.

Dr. A. O. Ruse, superintendent of the Marion County Infirmary, continues in office, having refused to relinquish his post. Attempts have been made to oust him because he refused to live at the institution. James Twinham, 1145 N. King-av., was to have been appointed to the post.

Dr. Ruse has served two years of a four-year term and while the commissioners have expressed approval of his administration they also said that they will attempt to have more vegetables grown at the farm. Mr. Twinham was considered, because of his farming experience, according to Commissioner Clarence I. Wheatley.

**Ruse Agrees on Point**

At a recent conference Dr. Ruse agreed to take up residence at the infirmary if suitable quarters are provided. Action has been postponed until later in the month.

Appointment of a highway superintendent has been delayed and Herbert Bloemker, county surveyor, will continue in his dual position.

**EARL MANN IN RACE  
FOR JENCKES SEAT**

**Terr Haute Attorney to Seek Democratic Nomination.**

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Jan. 2.—Predicted opposition to Mrs. Virginia Jenckes, Sixth District Representative, gathered fresh momentum today when Earl Mann, local attorney and fellow-townsman, announced his candidacy for the Democratic nomination.

Following by a few hours a similar announcement at Cayuga, where State Senator Alanson L. Albright disclosed his intention of seeking the Washington post, Mr. Mann's entry injected new interest in what promises to be a hard-fought factional battle. It was assumed here that he is to be supported by forces of Richard Wernke, veteran party leader and pronounced foe of Mrs. Jenckes.

A former state Representative, deputy prosecutor and Superior Judge, Mr. Mann, like Senator Albright, has declared himself a proponent of the Townsend plan.

**SEEKS TO BAR POLLS  
FROM NATION'S MAIIS**

Rep. W. M. Pierce to Ask Farley's Approval of Bill.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—Rep. Walter M. Pierce (D., Ore.) said today he would seek Postmaster General James A. Farley's approval of a bill to bar straw ballots on national political questions from the mails.

Rep. Pierce introduced such a bill at the last session of Congress. The Postoffice Department opposed it on the grounds that it would lose a valuable source of first class revenue.

"With the Literary Digest poll showing a trend against the New Deal, I feel that maybe Jim has changed his mind on my bill," Mr. Pierce said. "He promised to see me next week. If he says it is O. K., I am confident that we can get it through the committee."
