

## 60 BEGIN WORK IN SCHOOL FOR INDIANA POLICE

30 Experts Are to Lecture  
on Phases of Law  
Enforcement.

How to make the average experienced policeman a better officer is the object of the four-week training school which started yesterday at the U. S. Naval Training Armory, 630 E. Washington-st., under direction of Donald F. Stiver, state safety director.

The school is conducted for state police, but advanced training is given local or county enforcement officials who attend. The school is under immediate supervision of Lieut. Don Kookon of the state police.

This is the first advanced training ever undertaken by the department and 35 state police and five local officers are enrolled in the course.

**Instruction in All Phases**  
Instruction is being given in every phase of crime detection by 30 authorities. The lectures cover the accepted procedure in making arrests, filing reports, keeping notebooks and police law. Laboratory work is conducted in the use of small firearms, machine-guns, tear gas bombs and riot guns. Experts in legal procedure, conduct on the witness stand, constitutional rights, and first-aid are to lecture to the class. Federal enforcement officers from the Department of Justice, Narcotic Division, Secret Service and Alcohol Unit have been enlisted to give outlines of their work.

## FARM YOUTH IS GIVEN 20 YEARS IN BANK HOLDUP

20-Year-Old Boy of Tippecanoe County Admits  
\$1500 Theft.

MONTICELLO, Ind., Jan. 7.—Clarence Sekema, 20-year-old Tippecanoe County farm youth, pleaded guilty to bank robbery charges in White Circuit Court today and was sentenced to 20 years in the state reformatory.

He was charged with the \$1500 robbery yesterday of the Farmers State Bank of Brookston. Nineteen hours after the robbery he was on his way to the reformatory.

The youth was captured in a cornfield four miles west of Brookston, in White County, after he had wrecked a stolen automobile in

which he is alleged to have escaped the robbery scene.

State and local police and sheriffs' officers of White and Tippecanoe Counties discovered the wrecked machine and surrounded the nearby cornfield. Sekema surrendered without resistance.

More than \$900 of the loot was recovered in a pasteboard box found in the prisoner's home near Badger Grove, along the White-Tippecanoe County line.

Theodore Loveless of the state police announced Sekema had confessed the robbery. The youth was injured slightly when the automobile, which he is said to have stolen at a farm sale, was wrecked when he failed to negotiate a curve.

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Jan. 7.—Demonstrations and exhibits which are to be given during the Annual Agricultural Conference, opening at Purdue University Monday, were listed today by officials in charge.

Union Building: Indiana state corn and small grain show, 4-H corn club show, exhibits of hybrid corn, poisonous plants and peren-

nial weeds, plant diseases, insects and farm planting.

A potato exhibit is to be held daily at the Horticultural Building; birds, flocks and experimental animals shown in the Farm Building; and special exhibits offered in both the Home Economics and Poultry Buildings.

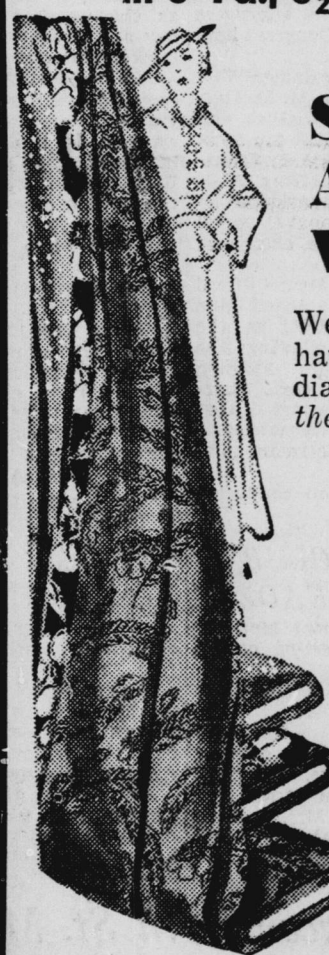

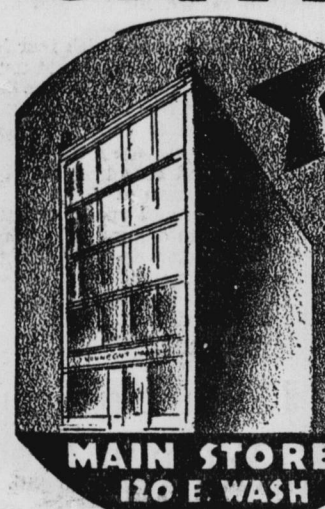

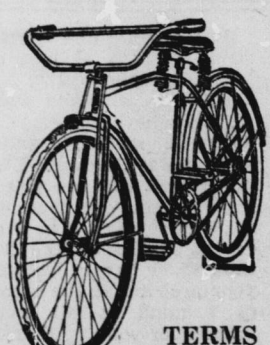
