HUNT FOR FORT WAYNE KILLER IS REOPENED

Forced Ride Reported by Taxi Driver Brings Police Action.

Fort Wayne, Ind., March 3.—Police today had resumed their search for the killer of Arlie Foster, local business man shot here last August, when a Lima (O.) taxi driver reported that a gunman forced him to drive from Lima to Fort Wayne.

The gunman's action tallied with that of a similar incident shortly after Foster's murder, when a man identified as John Smith, alias Earl Jacobs, forced another Lima taxi driver to make the trip to Fort Wayne.

Ellsworth Lamber, the taxi driver, failed to identify Smith's picture, however, as that of his passenger.
