

FEDERAL GRAND JURY PERSONNEL IS ANNOUNCED

Hearing of Evidence to Take Most of Week; Nolan to Go to Chicago.

The Federal Grand Jury continued today to review cases presented to it by Val Nolan, United States District Attorney. Hearing of evidence is expected to take most of the week. On Thursday Mr. Nolan will be in Chicago arguing a motion for an appeal of the death sentence of George W. Barrett, who killed a Federal agent at West College Corners, Ind., last August.

4000 ASK FOR NEW PROPERTY APPRAISAL

Petitions Filed With Tax Board Under 1935 State Act.

Less than 4000 petitions for reappraisal of real estate have been received by the State Tax Board this year, Secretary Anderson Ketchum announced today.

Petition for individual reappraisal of property is founded under a 1935 act which abolished general reappraisal.

The act provides that 25 per cent of the resident owners of property in any one township outside incorporated towns or cities of 10,000 population or less, or 3 per cent of population owners in a town of 10,000 population or less, may petition for reappraisal on or before Aug. 1. Reassessment powers were given the state board and its order is final.

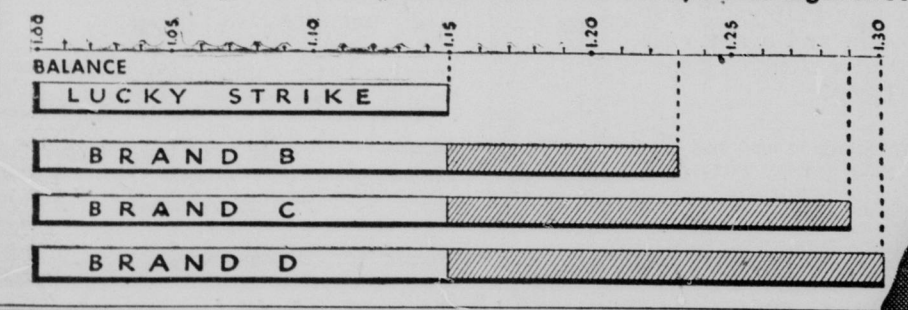
