

## Pinmen From 391 Cities to Roll in A.B.C.

All Parts of Nation to Be Represented in Big Bowling Meet.

If the present scoring records withstand the assaults of the thousands of pastimers who will be pouncing at the maps at the State Fairground Coliseum during the A. B. C. tournament, they will be the highest marks in connection with the event that failed to tumble.

The largest entry in the history of the annual event will place the decks during the 37 days of action, the 32 alleys that will bear the brunt of the pin snipers attacks are the most ever used in the big classic.

The prize list is the largest in history and now comes the announcement that the participants have been recruited from 391 cities in the United States.

This is 100 more than the previous record established at Syracuse last year. Bowlers from 28 states, Territory of Hawaii and the Dominion of Canada are scheduled to appear during the long grind.

Steve Hannagan and Larry Smith, publicity aces, are expected to arrive here from New York tomorrow to complete arrangements for the filming of the opening night's festivities.

Universities, Paramount, Hearst and Pathe News reels will focus a battery of cameras on the activities from a specially built platform in the Coliseum. It will be the first time in history that any part of the event has been filmed for movies.

Hannagan will also have charge of the radio broadcasts during the tournament and has arranged for Bob Brown, ace sports announcer of the NBC's Chicago staff, to put the opening night's program on the air.

Headed by Arnold Truensch, another squad of Secretary Baumgartner Milwaukee staff arrived here yesterday. Along with Baumgartner, Bob Marquart and Pete White, who arrived earlier in the week, they will handle all matters in connection with the operation of the event.

The unusually large list of entries has delayed the printing of the schedules, but Baumgartner's staff advised local officials upon their arrival that they would be off the press in time to arrive in the city some time today or tomorrow.

Lewis plans to leave immediately after the fight by plane for New York where he will work out in preparation for the McAvoy fight.

Simms is confident he can defeat the light-heavy champ and even predicts that he will be the indirect cause of Lewis' defeat when he meets McAvoy.

"I was the cause of Max Baer losing his title to Braddock," said Simms, "and I'll do the same thing to Lewis. Baer didn't hurt his hand in the fight with me before the Braddock battle. What cost him the title was a hard right I landed."
