

REALTOR URGES STAND AGAINST TAX INCREASES

Albert E. Uhl Calls for Action to Curb Levies by Legislature.

Members of the Indianapolis Real Estate Board today had been warned by Albert E. Uhl, chairman of the legislation and taxation committee, that the special session of the Legislature will place a greater tax burden on real estate owners unless defensive action is taken.

Mr. Uhl, speaking to realtors and associate members of the board yesterday at their luncheon in the Washington, said he "assumed the special session will last the entire 40 days." He urged members to support tax reduction.

Frank Murray, South Bend, realtor, and Asa E. Chambers, president of the Bethard Wall Paper Co., suggested an organization of property owners to fight any proposed increase in real estate taxes.

Other speakers were Lawrence G. Holmes, Chicago, representative of the National Association of Real Estate Boards, who discussed the regional convention to be held in Indianapolis May 28 and 29, and Richard E. Mills, attorney, who gave a humorous talk on "Three Current Problems."
