

## FHA DIRECTOR SAYS BUILDING TO BE EASIER

Peters Sees More Adequate  
Mortgage Facilities in  
Grotto Talk.

Home builders are expected to find ways paved for more adequate mortgage facilities during the coming year, according to R. Earl Peters, state Federal Housing Administration director, who spoke to the Sahara Grotto Club today.

Revisions in mortgage practices, Mr. Peters says, is due largely to increased safety to lenders, as well as to the attraction of long-term insured mortgages.

"The whole aspect of lending is changed today," Mr. Peters said, "because of reforms introduced under the FHA. Home financing charges have been reduced, and the uniform interest rate established serves to restore health and vigor to residential construction."

He stated the country was coming into the building season with a balance between the needs and financing facilities for the first time in several years.

A year ago, he said, mortgage money virtually was frozen, but today funds are generally available to home builders everywhere. Construction developments also have bettered the value of the home, making it a better investment, he pointed out.

In the face of a severe winter, building has improved over the same periods of the last two years, Mr. Peters declared. The year's test of the mortgage practices should bring the construction of at least 2500 new homes in the state within the next three months, he said.

## PHIL KENAMER MUST SERVE 25-YEAR TERM

Oklahoma Court of Appeals Affirms  
Sentence Unanimously.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., March 13.—Phil Kenamer, brilliant, madcap 20-year-old son of United States Judge Franklin E. Kenamer, Tulsa, must serve his 25-year prison sentence on conviction of manslaughter in the slaying of John F. Gorrell Jr., at Tulsa, on Thanksgiving eve, 1934.

The State Criminal Court of Appeals today affirmed his sentence in a unanimous decision written by Judge Thomas Doyle.

Kenamer admitted shooting Gorrell to death in his car near a Tulsa hospital.

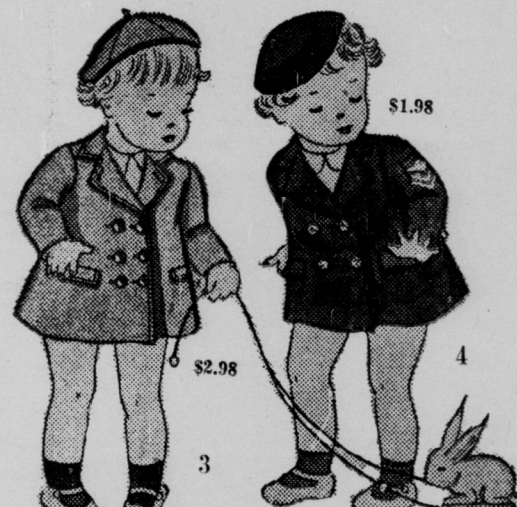

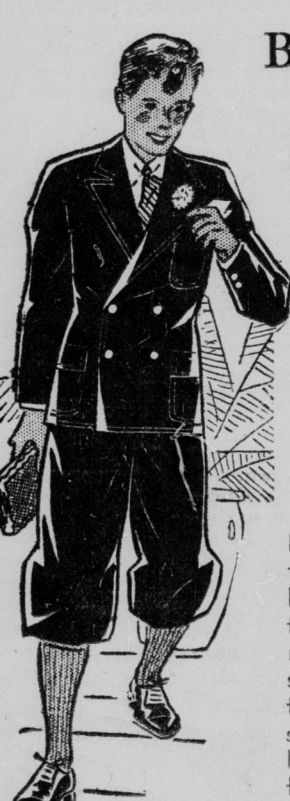
