

INDIANA SOCIAL SECURITY BOARD MEMBERS MEET

Hope to Put New Welfare Department to Work by April 1.

Hoping to place the newly created public welfare and unemployment compensation departments into full operation by April 1, state social security board members held organization meetings in the Statehouse this morning.

These two boards, a heritage to the citizenry from the special session of the General Assembly, were set up by Gov. McNutt. It was reported that Clarence A. Jackson, gross income tax division director, also is scheduled to be director of the unemployment compensation department, and that Wayne Coy, Governor's Unemployment Commission director, is to become public welfare department administrator.

The welfare board may use the machinery of the gross income tax department, for the present at least, to set up the job insurance plan, it was said. Employers are to make a first payment of 1.2 per cent of the pay roll, starting April 1.

Budget Must Be Formulated

In order to obtain Federal grants, the public welfare department is required to formulate its budget and file it with the Federal Social Security Board prior to April 1.

The old public welfare division was abolished yesterday when Mr. Coy dismissed 15 employees of the department. Offices of the department were closed today and Mr. Coy ceased to be its director. It was indicated the new board probably is to rehire these employees.

There is to be no change in the local administration of old-age pensions, aid to dependent children and blind persons until county welfare departments are in operation and their setups approved by the State Board of Public Welfare.

Judges to Name County Boards

Circuit court judges are to name members of the county boards, and these boards are to assume the duties now exercised by county commissioners in payment of old-age pensions, and the work of the boards of children's guardians and other local welfare activities.

It is estimated that the vast new public welfare bureaus are to spend approximately \$14,850,000 next year, about half of which is to come from the Federal government. Several hundred additional employees are to be put on the public pay rolls.

HIGHWAY BOARD CONTRACTS FOR WORK ON ROADS

Surfacing Grade Elevation Jobs in 5 Counties to Cost \$327,000.

The State Highway Commission today announced award of contracts for surfacing and grade elevation projects in Knox, Huntington, Wells, Warren and Clark counties.

The work, aggregating approxi-

mately \$327,000, is to be financed with state, Federal and Federal-aid funds. The contract awards were:

Knox County—Widening existing grade separation on Road 41 over C. E. & I. Railroad, 0.9 miles south of Oaktown; one span, 38 feet; Scheire & Jarrell, Frankfort; \$3840.40. Completion date, July 1, 1936.

Huntington and Wells Counties—Surfacing (bituminous retread plantmix) 12.04 miles on State Road 116, from Markle to Bluffton; Midwest Roads Co., Indianapolis; \$178,149.35. Completion date, Nov. 1, 1936.

Warren County—Grading and structures on 8.247 miles on State Road 63, from 2.5 miles south of

Paris, Ill., as their 1936 prom queen.



