

BARRETT HOLDS 2 SLIM HOPES AGAINST NOOSE

G-Man Slayer Scheduled to Walk to Gallows Here Tuesday.

George W. Barrett, Kentucky feudist, whose career in crime goes back to 1913, has only two chances of escaping death by hanging here early Tuesday morning for the murder of a Federal agent. Both chances are slim.

The remaining possibilities are an appeal to the Supreme Court of the United States and the granting of a writ of error in the trial evidence.

Barrett is penniless. To obtain counsel to prepare an appeal it was necessary for him to take a pauper's oath.

Federal Judge Robert C. Baltzell provided Barrett with four local attorneys, who prepared the appeal, and paid the costs of the brief and their expenses to Chicago. There is no provision in Federal court procedure for fees for pauper attorneys.

Since informed that the Court of Appeals had upheld the decision of the lower court, Barrett has given no indication of asking for an appeal to the Supreme Court.

Finding of an error in the evidence also is unlikely, lawyers say, because it was studied carefully by his four attorneys who filed the appeal. Also it was studied thoroughly by the Appellate Court judges before the sentence was upheld.



