STATE FOREST FINANCE ASKED

Emergency Funds Sought
for Use in Purchase
of Land.

WASHINGTON, March 27.—Restoration by the Senate of \$10,000,000 for continuation of forest area purchases in the states will solve the problem of the four under way in Indiana until Congress meets again and additional appropriations can be made, Rep. Eugene B. Crowe said today.

Having failed to get a \$12,000,000 item for this purpose inserted in the Agriculture Appropriation Bill in the House, Rep. Crowe had petitioned President Roosevelt, Secretary of Agriculture Wallace and Budget Director Bell to carry on the purchases with emergency funds. If the House approves the Senate amendments to Agriculture Bill this will not now be necessary, Mr. Crowe said. For the \$10,000,000 will be sufficient to carry the program along.

Four areas for such purchases have been laid out in Indiana. They include Lafayette with 201,000 acres, of which 13,000 have been purchased; Lost River, 182,000 with 7,000 bought; Patoka, 209,000 with 60,000 bought, and Pleasant Run, 189,000, with 8,000 bought.

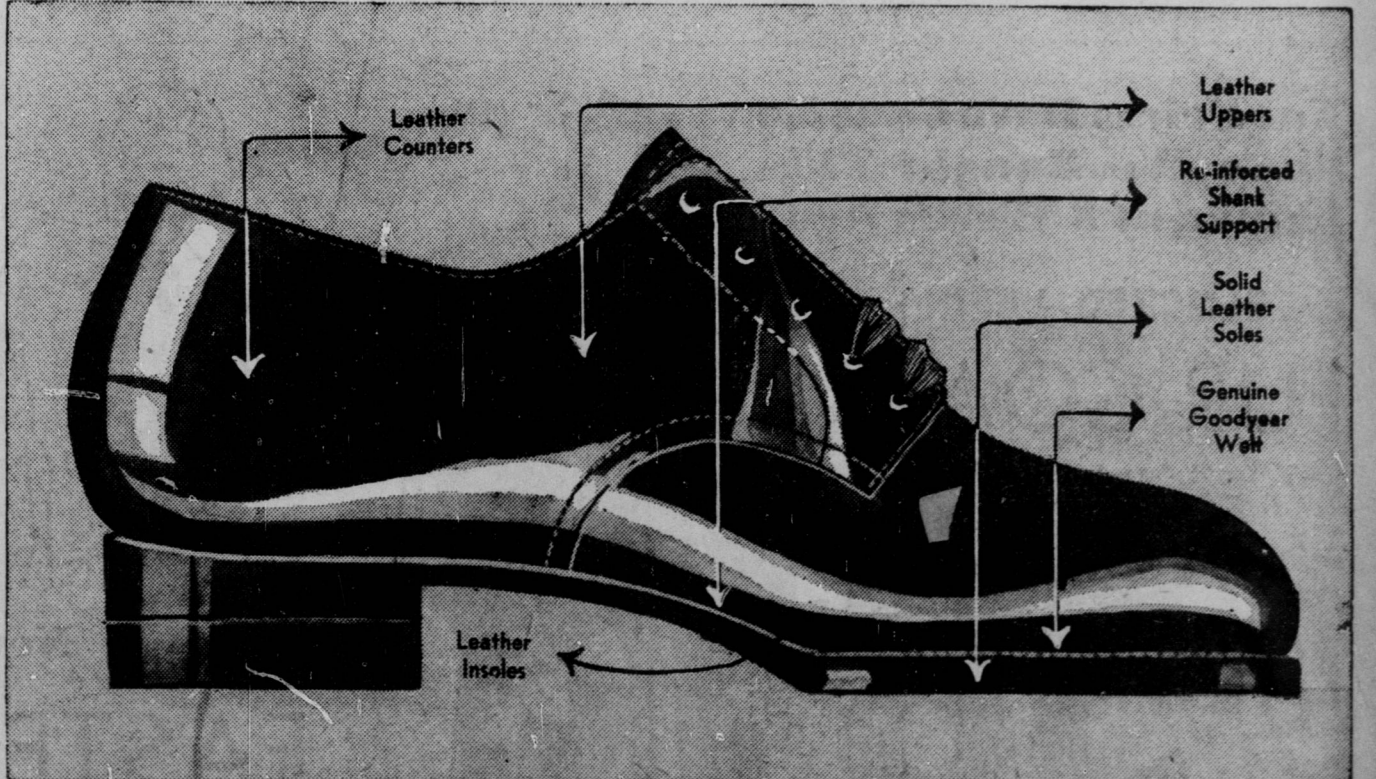
