### COLD WEATHER SLOWS FISHING, REPORTS SHOW

Game Wardens Point Out  
Best Streams for  
Sportsmen.

Unseasonable cold weather has slowed fishing in Indiana considerably, state game wardens note in their first collective report of the season, but there still are some places where they are biting.

The report, by counties, issued today by the Fish and Game division of the Conservation Department, follows:

Lake—Fish are biting fair in Wolf, George, Deep River, Cedar Lake and Lake Dale Carle. Slightly above normal, and semi-clear. Ducks, geese and gulls are coming up north. Plentiful on lakes and streams.

White and Benton—Shaffer and Freeman lakes are in good shape for fishing. Crappies are not biting very well. Fishing should be good by week-end in a few days.

Crappies Biting Fair  
Porter—Sal Lake semi-clear. Burns Ditch clear. Little Calumet River is busy. Kankakee River clearing fast. Flint, Long, Loomis, Mink, Wabash, Sugar Creek, Elletts are all clear and normal. Suckers biting well. Crappies and bluegills biting fair. About 1500 ducks on ponds and lakes. No reports of duck shooting.

Carroll—Streams in Carroll County are up a little and milky. Not many fish caught yet in the creek. In Lake Freeman, good number of crappie and some black bass caught.

Howard and Grant—Mississippi River is about two feet higher and muddier. Wildcat Creek in Howard and Grant high but fairly clear.

Delaware and Randolph—Streams are a little above normal, and a little milky. Will be in good shape in a few days if no heavy rain comes.

Warren and Fountain—All streams clear, and in good shape for fishing. Henry and Wayne—Streams are all full and swift, but clear.

Tippecanoe and Montgomery—Tippecanoe River is clear. Wabash muddier. Wild Cat Creek in Tippecanoe River is clear. Raccoon Creek is clear. Several bass reported caught in Tippecanoe River last Sunday.

Union and Fayette—All streams are muddier, and rain looks like making them stay so.

Tippecanoe and Hamilton—All streams are high, some fish being caught on live bait.

Week-End Prospects Good  
Madison and Hancock—Small streams are clearing and should be in good shape by week-end. Fishing is slow. White River is muddier.

Martin—Pulaski Creek and Eagle Creek are clear. Buck Creek clear. White River is clear and high. All gravel pits in fine shape.

Clinton and Boone—Streams and pits are in good shape. Fish are not biting so well.

Lawrence—All streams and White River high for fishing. White perch have been seen and a few caught at the Williams Dam, and if no more rain many should be caught over the week-end.

Davison and Martin—Both forks of White River are at flood stage and the tributaries of these rivers are backed up and in some cases are flooded. However, several fishermen have been out in lakes and old beds and some fine catches have been made. Some extra large crappies taken from Swan Pond Saturday and Sunday.

Perry—All lakes, ponds and streams in this county are up and muddier, no good fishing.

Crawford and Perry—All streams in these counties are too high for fishing. If no more rain before week-end Little Blue River in Crawford will be in good shape for fishing.

Jennings and Ripley—All streams are milky. Fishing just fair.

Base Hitting Fair  
Parke and Vermillion—All streams are fairly high and clear. Bass are hitting fair.

Clark and Floyd—Fourteen Mile Creek, Silver Creek, Muddy Fork, Big and Little Indian are all muddier. All creeks are high and fishing is poor. A few large mouth bass have been caught. Ohio River is high and muddier.

Dearborn and Ohio—All streams are muddier except Hoan's Creek and Tanners Creek on the upper part. Back water from the swollen Ohio River reaches up on all creeks for several miles, and the opinion is that the creeks will be well stocked this spring.

Pike and Dubois—Lakes and streams muddier, fishing is poor.

Jefferson and Switzerland—All streams are high and muddier, fishing poor.

Greene—All streams are muddier.

Orange and Washington—Streams up and milky. Will be o. k. by Sunday if no more rain.

Sullivan—Water is very cold and muddier. Fish are not biting.

Harrison—Big Blue River is milky. Fishing is fair. Big Indian is muddier. Fishing is fair. Big Buck Creek is clear, and fishing is good.
