

# PROHIBITIONISTS NAME NOMINEES FOR FALL RACE

Party Selects Educator as  
Candidate for Indiana  
Governorship.

The Prohibition Party today launched a campaign for election of state officers on a liberal platform of social reform.

Dr. Gilbert Mason, Huntington College, was selected as the party's candidate for Governor at a state meeting yesterday in the Wheeler Rescue Mission.

Other candidates and offices they are seeking are Herman L. Seeger, Indianapolis, lieutenant governor; David Noland, Linton, secretary of state; Mrs. Altie Stoddard, Indianapolis, auditor of state; G. A. Hotell, Georgetown, treasurer; Prof. Walter Brinson, Anderson, superintendent of public instruction; and A. D. Lewis, Supreme Court reporter.

## Platform Is Outlined

Features of the 18-point platform includes abolition of the dole and made-work expenditures, state-owned bank, state housing authority to eliminate slum areas, formation of a state industries board for promoting employment of idle persons, abandonment of use of military forces as instruments of force to break strikes, consolidation of taxing units, a state insurance corporation, adequate old-age pensions and abolition of contract labor in state penal institutions.

Edward Blake, Chicago, national chairman, in his keynote address said that the public was disgusted with the major political parties and pointed to the failure of either major party to make an unemployment survey.

Mr. Blake scoffed at the Republican issue of "save the Constitution," stating, "The Republicans did not attempt to preserve the Eighteenth Amendment in the Constitution."

## To Attend Convention

"We made a mistake in trying to solve our economic problems instead of solving our moral problems first," he said in connection with

the repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment.

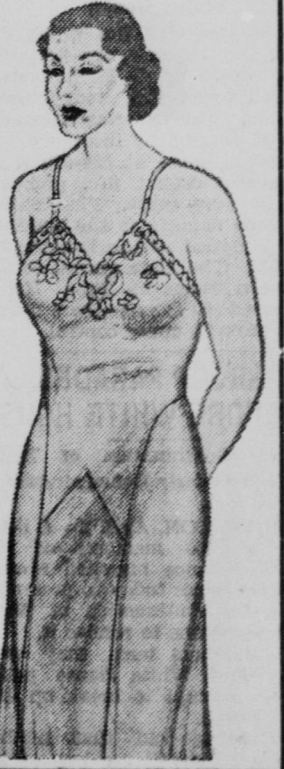
