

PROHIBITIONISTS NAME NOMINEES FOR FALL RACE

Party Selects Educator as
Candidate for Indiana
Governorship.

The Prohibition Party today
launched a campaign for election
of state officers on a liberal
platform of social reform.

Dr. Gilbert Mason, Huntington
College, was selected as the party's
candidate for Governor at a state
meeting yesterday in the Wheeler
Rescue Mission.

Other candidates and offices they
are seeking are Herman L. Seeger,
Indianapolis, lieutenant governor;
David Noland, Lizton, secretary of
state; Mrs. Altie Stoddard, Indian-
apolis, auditor of state; G. A. Hot-
tell, Georgetown, treasurer; Prof.
Walter Brinson, Anderson, superin-
tendent of public instruction, and
A. D. Lewis, Supreme Court repre-
senter.

Platform Is Outlined

Features of the 18-point platform
includes abolition of the dole and
make work expenditures, state-
owned bank, state housing authority
to eliminate slum areas, formation
of a state industries board for pro-
moting employment of idle persons,
abandonment of use of military
forces as instruments of force to
break strikes, consolidation of tax-
ing units, state insurance cor-
poration, adequate old-age pensions
and abolition of contract labor in
state penal institutions.

Edward Blake, Chicago, national
chairman, in his keynote address
said that the public was disgusted
with the major political parties and
pointed to the failure of either
major party to make an unemploy-
ment survey.

Mr. Blake scoffed at the Repub-
lican issue of "save the Constitu-
tion," stating: "The Republicans did
not attempt to preserve the Eight-
eenth Amendment in the Constitu-
tion."
