

JUNGLE BEASTS ROAR START OF CIRCUS SEASON

Cole Bros.-Beatty Show to Open Saturday at Chicago.

ROCHESTER, Ind., April 8.—Lions, tigers, elephants, camels and other beasts of the jungle and plains were loaded with more than 500 persons on brilliantly painted railroad cars here today as the Cole Brothers-Clyde Beatty circus began its second season.

The show will open in Chicago Stadium April 11 for a 23-day run and will return here May 4 for its first presentation of the season under canvas.

A lengthy itinerary, still being drafted, will follow as Jess Adkins and Zack Terrell, managers of the show, prepare for the "greatest circus season since the war."

New Act Presented
Headline animal acts of the show were presented in preview at the winter quarters for newspaper men and newsreel cameras.

Highlight of the event was presentation of an elephant, a tiger and a lion in one ring—the first time the three natural enemies have been joined, according to Clyde Beatty, star of the show.

Beatty and his beautiful blond wife, Harriet, a newcomer to the Rochester circus, both worked the act.

They also presented a preview of their final number, in which 40 "cats" are brought into the central cage at one time.

200 Acts Each Showing
A troupe of Cremonese horses, only ones in the United States, were exercised by Jack Joyce, another newcomer with the Cole Brothers show.

The elephant herd included Jumbo, the only African elephant in the United States. Indian elephants, smaller and more tractable, are used regularly, circus attaches said.

The show this year will include nearly 200 acts and will carry a personnel of more than 1000 persons when the "canvass season" opens, according to Ora Parks, advance agent.

MOTORCYCLES ADDED TO POLICE FACILITIES

City Safety Board Spends \$1460 to Stamp Out Recklessness.

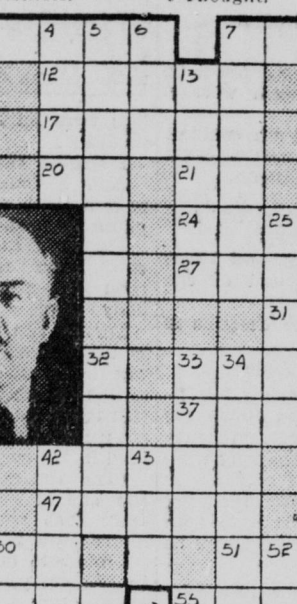
