

FHA EXECUTIVE SURVEYS SITES IN BEECH GROVE

\$2,500,000 Housing Project Approval Sought by Homestead Society.

Col. Cornelius Beard, FHA representative from Washington, today was making a survey of the proposed \$2,500,000 housing project in Beech Grove.

Listed as an authority on low cost housing problems, Col. Beard is to report his findings to Miles Colean, of FHA. Definite action on this project, which failed to get support from the Resettlement Administration, is expected to be taken within the next few weeks, it was indicated.

Federal funds are being sought by the National Suburban Homestead Society of America, which has representatives in 140 industrial and commercial institutions in this city.

Says Railroads Lack Homes

Bert Wilhelm, society president and organizer, has claimed that housing facilities in Beech Grove now are so inadequate that many of the employees in the Big Four shops have been unable to find homes.

Many of these employees, moved here recently from Cleveland, are forced to commute every week-end between Beech Grove and that city, Mr. Wilhelm said.

Col. Beard yesterday visited the two sites proposed by the society. One is a 600-acre tract located south and adjacent to Beech Grove, and the other is a 200-acre section in the northwestern part of that city. The society has asked the Reconstruction Finance Corp. to loan money to build the homes, and the FHA to become the insuring agency. Members propose to build houses on one-half to two-acre tracts that are within the \$2800 to \$5000 price range.

211 STILLS SMASHED BY INDIANA AGENTS

State Division Collected \$25,309 in Fines, Report Shows.

Illegal liquor operations, reminiscent of prohibition days, were reflected today in a report of the State Alcoholic Beverages Enforcement Division showing 211 alcohol stills were destroyed during the last 10 months.

A total of \$25,309 was collected in fines for liquor law violations, 445 persons being arrested and 238 convictions obtained. Fines suspended totaled \$4463; 1500 days suspended; judgment was withheld in 13 cases; 37 cases dismissed, and eight found not guilty.

State excise officers, under direction of Ray Hinkle, enforcement chief, made 8161 investigations, obtained 1886 arrests and 657 convictions during the 10-month period. A total of \$3207 was obtained from sale of liquor and other confiscated articles at public auctions.

GARDEN PLOTS SET ASIDE FOR RELIEF CLIENTS

Miss Noone Is Co-operating With Governor's Board in County Project.

Hannah A. Noone, Center Township trustee, and the Governor's Commission on Unemployment Relief are co-operating in a garden project for Marion County relief clients. Individual, home and group gardens are included.

Applications for space are being received at Miss Noone's office and by Robert Elder, garden project supervisor. Clients assigned to plots are to receive cards entitling them to a supply of seeds and

plants, furnished by the Governor's Commission it was announced. Four cleanup men and two tractors with plows are at work on the 40-acre tract northwest of the Butler Fieldhouse, on which the group gardens, each 50 by 100 feet, are to be situated. The use of the land is contributed by the university. The tract is limited to 500 plots. Miss Noone's office already has distributed 940 packages of seeds for home gardens, located in tracts operated by clients at home. Some clients are to tend both home and group gardens.
