CLUBS TO HELP GAME DIVISION

State to Distribute 75,000
Pheasant, Quail Eggs
for Hatching.

Organized Indiana conservation clubs are to receive 75,000 pheasant and quail eggs for hatching during the coming season, Virgil M. Simmons, Conservation Department commissioner, announced today.

The largest distribution ever to be made in Indiana, this shipment is to go to more than 200 clubs holding contracts with the Division of Fish and Game.

In addition, 60,000 eggs are to be hatched in electric incubators of the Jasper-Pulaski and Wells County state game farms.

Clubs are to liberate the birds hatched in local areas providing suitable cover as a supplement to game birds propagated at state farms.

A successful hatch of the distribution this year thoroughly would stock Indiana fields with game birds, said Mr. Simmons.
