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CHAMBER HONORS LABORATORY HEAD

Junior C. of C. Award Given
Dr. C. G. Culbertson.

Dr. Clyde G. Culbertson, laboratory director of Indiana University Medical School and the State Health Board, today possessed the Junior Chamber of Commerce distinguished service award for 1933.

Presentation was made last night by Mayor Kern at a dinner meeting at the Lincoln. The award is to be made annually to members for outstanding contributions to civic betterment.

The award was given Dr. Culbertson for his direction of medical tests for physicians and state and Federal institutions. Dr. Verne K. Harvey, director of the Indiana public health division, lauded Dr. Culbertson as an executive, teacher and scientist, saying he had increased efficiency in the two laboratories on reduced budgets.

Dr. Culbertson is 29 and a native of Vevay. He was graduated from Indiana University Medical School in 1931 and became head of the laboratory the same year. He received the appointment to the state post in 1933.

STUDENTS HEAR BISHOP OXNAM'S FAREWELL TALK

Devotes Hour to Discussion
of Eight Years as
School Head.

GREENCASTLE, Ind., May 28.—Marking a milestone in his career, Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam, retiring president of De Pauw University, delivered his farewell address to students yesterday.

From the chapel platform in crowded Meharry Hall, the newly named Methodist Church official devoted an hour to an extemporaneous discussion of his eight years as the university head.

“If I have counted correctly,” he said smiling, “I have spoken 621

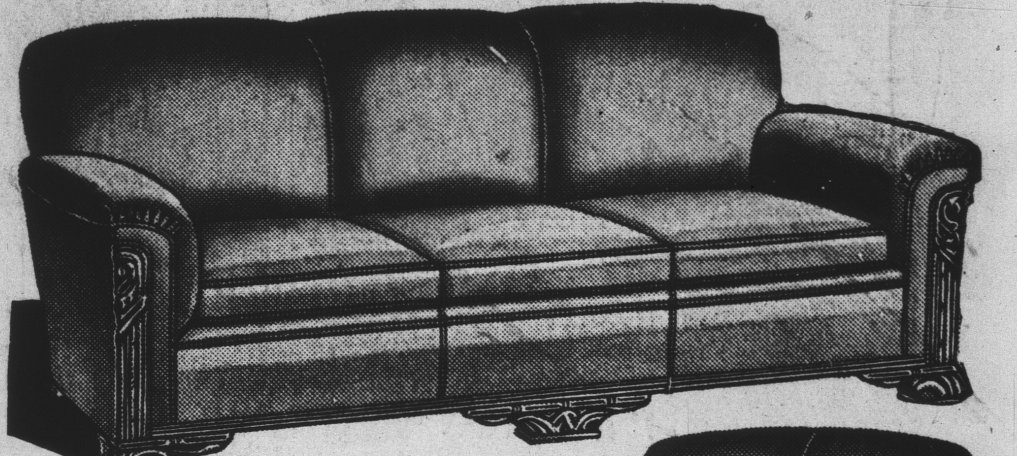
times before the student body of De Pauw.”
On the platform beside him was Dr. Henry Boyer Longden, university vice president, who retired a year ago. Behind them sat faculty members. It was a scene familiar to De Pauw audiences.
Speaking at length on the decisions one is compelled to make—what he termed “the if-moments of life,” Dr. Oxnam said:
“You are going into communities where you will find little people that lie, spread rumors and are provincial. You, too, can become little, but remember, there are big people in the community.”
“A lot of you,” he continued further, “are going out as teachers. There is always the danger that a person who specializes will become narrow and provincial in other fields.”

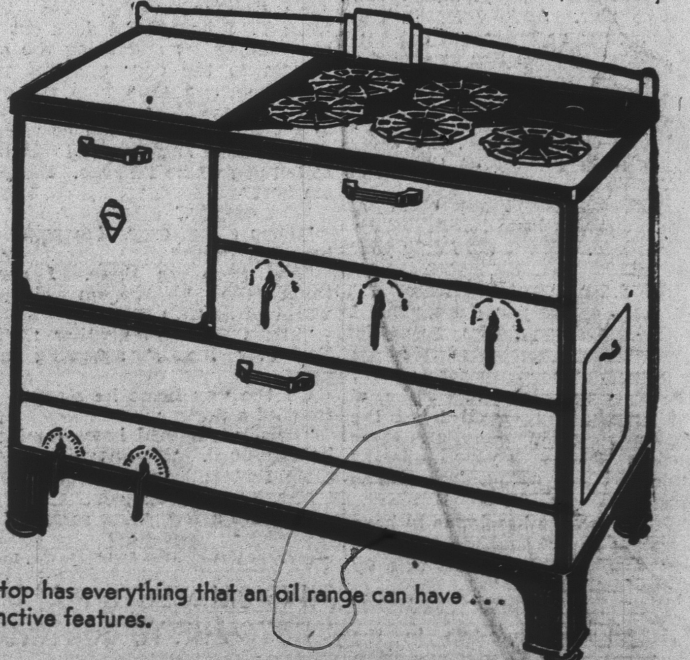
