Mrs. Trueblood, who was 80, was born in Parke County, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Adams, pioneer residents of that section of the state. She was a member of the First Friends Church.

In addition to her daughter, Mrs. Trueblood is survived by a brother, Edgar Adams, and a sister, Mrs. A. B. Overman, both of Rockville; two nephews, R. E. Adams and W. R. Adams, both of this city, and a granddaughter, Catherine Hadley, Seattle.

## LOCAL MAN OWNS NAPOLEONIC MEDAL

Grandfather Received It 115 Years Ago.

A medal, now in the possession of Paul Gall, 3751 Central-av, was given to his grandfather, Karl Gall, 115 years ago by Napoleon.

His grandfather, who lived to be 101 years old, served in the Little Corporal's army for 23 years in Russia, Italy and the German states.

During the retreat from Russia Karl Gall lived for weeks on black bread, the story goes. Enduring great hardships he finally escaped from the country.

Paul Gall remembers his grandfather, having attended the old soldier's diamond wedding anniversary when but five years old. The celebration was held in Bittighheim in the southern part of Germany.

The medal bears this inscription: "To my companions in glory, my last thought, St. Helena, 5 May, 1821. Napoleon, First Emperor."

## G. O. P. PLANKS ARE PLAYED BY SOCIALIST CHIEF

Tomsich Says Republicans Are 'Shadow-Boxing' With Main Issues.

The Republican state platform, adopted yesterday, was termed today as "shadow boxing with the issues of the day" by Mario Tomsich, Gary, Socialist, candidate for Governor.

"The Republican Party of the state has once again shown its incompetency to deal with the issues that face the men and women of Indiana. Their nine-point program completely disregards the problems of unemployment relief, labor rela-

tions and social security," Mr. Tomsich says.

"Are there so many jobs for willing workers of the state that this, a major political party, can ignore the question of unemployment relief?"

"Group of Job Holders"

"If this is all the Republican Party has to offer, it has lost all reasons for its existence and is merely an organization of job holders and prospective job holders, and will be consigned to its self-dug grave by the electorate of the state," declares Mr. Tomsich.

"They cry, 'reduce taxes,' but they have no other plan to offer whereby they will raise the money to carry on the state."

"In contrast to this shadow-boxing, the Socialist Party states clearly its opposition to taxes on all homes valued at \$3,500 or less and occupied by the owner."

### Rugged Individualism

"As the campaign develops, it becomes clear that the workers, the farmers, and the youth of the nation will never again look to the rugged individualism of Herbert Hoover and the Republican Party

to lead them out of the wilderness of hunger and economic insecurity. The fight is now between those who seek to reform an outworn system of capitalism and those who, like the Socialist Party, stand openly in favor of establishing a new order of society based upon the social ownership of industry," he said.
